To the Common Council:—

In obedience to the resolution of your Honorable Body, we do hereby submit plans and specifications for culvert on Hill street now on file in the City Clerk’s Office, the same is hereby transmitted, and that we estimate the sum of four hundred dollars will be necessary to build the same.

We further recommend that culverts be ordered constructed at Fifth street 2d ward, Felch street 3rd ward, over Allen’s creek and Mill race.

Also that an appropriation be made for tiling Detroit street, from Division street north to Mr. Weidlich’s property, and that an appropriation be made for grading the point between Beakes and Detroit streets.

We also submit in obedience to the resolution of your Honorable Body, Mt. Elliott Ave. as a sample street sign, and would recommend the adoption of such signs for the City, and would ask for an appropriation of \$500 for such signs.

We hereby submit Street Commissioner Sutherland’s annual report from Jan. 1st to Dec. 31st, 1891.
