REPORTS OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES.

To the Common Council.

Your committee appointed March 14th, last and charged with the duty of obtaining and reporting the terms and conditions upon which the city could obtain the right of way, for the straightening and widening Summit street, west of Main street, respectfully report in your committee's view, it would be advisable to make the said street at the point in question a 61-foot street, 33 feet on the north side of the center line and 28 feet on the south side, the center line to be the same mentioned in the resolution ordering the proposed improvement.

Your committee has obtained, without cost to the city, a deed from Daniel Hiscock, conveying a strip of land 33 feet in width, north from the proposed center line, that such deed has been delivered to the city and accompanies this report.

Your committee further report that Mr. Hugh McGuire has executed and is now ready to deliver to the city, a deed conveying a strip of land 28 feet in width, south of such center line, on payment of the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars. Mr. McGuire also agrees, in this connection, to discontinue, without cost, his suit against the city now pending in the circuit court; that none of the other land owners west from Mr. McGuire will be encroached upon if the street is made only 61 feet in width; we also find that a 61-foot street, will correspond in width, with Sum-

mit street, east of Main street as now fenced.

Your committee would therefore recommend a disposition of this matter as follows:

1st. That Mr. Hiscock's deed be accepted with thanks.

2d. That Mr. McGuire's offer be also accepted, and the sum of one hundred and twenty-five dollars be appropriated from the street fund and paid to Mr. McGuire's attorney, J. C. Knowlton, on the delivery of a deed conveying the lands for a street, as before stated, and on condition that such suit be discontinued without cost.

All of which is respectfully submitted and your committee beg to be discharged from further consideration of the subject.

To the Common Council:

The undersigned members of the Board of Election Commissioners of the city of Ann Arbor beg leave to report as follows:

The board organized by electing Louis P. Hall, chairman, and W. J. Miller, secretary. An examination and count of the official ballots before they were delivered to the inspectors of election and after they were returned to the city clerk shows that there

were delivered the various wards 5,090 ballots, which were accounted for as follows:

We find that everything connected with the election so far as came within our observation was done according to law, the seals all intact and the ballots returned properly with the exception that seventeen ballots were returned from the second ward with the unused ballots, which ballots were evidently thrown out as defective and not counted and which should have been put in ballot box, and that there are two (2) ballots in the third ward not accounted for.
