Your committee on streets to whom was referred the petition of certain persons interested in lands on Brooks street asking for grades and grading on such street, and a certain resolution asking for an appropriation to grade Gott street, and a certain communication from the Board of Public Works asking for an appropriation for the grading of East Huron street and Thirteenth street, and a certain petition of property holders on Depot street objecting to the laying of a spur along Depot street crossing track Fourth avenue, and a certain petition of residents on Monroe street, asking for a grade to be established, and to grade the street to the grade, respectfully report that they have had the various matters under consideration. and would recommend that all such matter be disposed of as follows:

# To the Common Council:

Your committee on Fire Department, to whom was referred the communication of the Board of Fire Commissioners relative to equipping a fire company in the 6th ward, respectfully report that they agree with the board, that it would be inadvisable and inexpedient to weaken the department at the central station. The board estimates that it would cost \$3,975, and that the maintenance after the first year, the company would cost annually \$2,250. While this seems to be a large sum of money, pevertheless your committee deem the establishment of the company in the 6th ward necessary for the ample protection of property in that ward, and parts of the 4th and 1st wards.

We would therefore recommend the appropriation of \$4,000 for the estab-

lishment of a company in the 6th ward and its maintenance for one year.
