FROM THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS

To the Common Council:

As requested by your honorable body, we submit the following report: That in May, 1889, the salary for the office of Street Commissioner was established at \$800 per year; the Commissioner to furnish a horse and wagon. Further, that said Board of Public Works have not changed the amount of such established salary.

Whereas, Having received certain information that there have been irregularities in the transaction of certain business intrusted to the Board of Public Works, which I deem require an investigation by the Council; and,

Whereas, I am also led to believe that other members of this Council are more or less informed as to the truth of this information; therefore be it

Resolved, That a committee of five (5) be appointed, and employ a short-hand reporter to take such testimony as they in their judgment deem best, to ascertain the truth of said rumors, and report to the Council at the first meeting in May, 1895, at 7:30 p. m.

Ald. Prettyman moved as a substitute that a committee of three, consisting of Ald. Martin, Manly and Wood, be appointed to formulate charges against President A. M. Clark.

Ald. Martin offered as an amendment that the committee consist of five, and that Ald. Prettyman and Brown be added to the committee already named.

The amendment prevailed as follows.

Nays—Ald. Brown, Prettyman, Pres. Wines—3.
