lawful authority of the said city: said engineer may, subject to the approval of the board of public works, appoint such assistants under him as are required for the proper and prompt performance of his duties and discharge such assistants at pleasure, said board shall also have the power to appoint suitable persons, who shall have the personal supervision of the construction and repair of the public building : and the said board shall have the power to appoint, subject to the approval of the common council, a street commissioner, who shall have charge of the grading, paving, improving, cleaning and care of the streets, sidewalks, alleys, and public grounds, the construction of sidewalks, and the cleaning and deepening the ditches, drains and gutters, under the direction of said board of public works, who may remove the said street commissioner at pleasure, and may appoint such other subordinates as may be necessary to enable the board to properly perform the duties devolving Said board shall determine upon it. the compensation of said engineer and other appointees of said board, subject to a change by a majority vote of all the members elect of the common council; and all other claims for the same, when certified by the board, shall be submitted to the common council for allowance and payment, in the same manner as other claims against the city.
