Resolved, that consent, permission and authority is hereby granted to the Detroit, Ypsilanti & Ann Arbor Ry. to run its Detroit cars within the limits of the city of Ann Arbor, for one month only at a rate of speed as follows, to-wit:

Between the waiting room on Main street to Division street, fifteen miles per hour; between Division street and State street, twelve miles per hour; and between State street and city limits, at the rate of twenty miles per hour.

Ald. Hamilton moved as a substitute that the matter be deferred until the next regular meeting, so as to give the property holders along the line a chance to voice their opinion in the matter.

An ordinance to amend an ordinance entitled an ordinance relative to naming streets.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordains:

Section one. That an ordinance of the City of Ann Arbor entitled an ordinance relative to naming streets, be and the same is hereby amended by adding a new section thereto, to stand as section eighteen and reads as follows:

Section eighteen. That the names of the streets, lying north easterly from Washtenaw ave. and connected with Hill street as now located, and heretofore called Spring streets and Myrtle street, be and the same are hereby changed and shall hereafter be named, known and called Hill street, and considered as a continuation of Hill street, as now laid out and established.

This ordinance shall take effect on and be in force after legal publication. Adopted as follows:

To the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your special committee appointed with directions to investigate and report whether the rate or charges of the Ann Arbor Water Company for supplying water for domestic purposes are reasonable, beg leave to report that they have met and formulated a plan of procedure which provides for a report to such committee, from the Water Company, of the gross receipts and cost of operating expenses for the year of 1899, and your committee applied to the superintendent and president of such Water Company to be furnished such information, and that the superintendent appear before said committee and produce for examination the books of the said Company, all of which reasonable request of your committee was refused by both the superintendent and president of such company.

Your committee would therefore recommend that the council request that Mr. William G. Doty, Esq., a Justice of the Peace do issue a subpoena commanding and requiring A. Kent Hale, Regnald Spokes, Frederick Adams and George Ristine and such other persons as the chairman of your committee may designate, and that A. Kent Hale bring with him and produce before your committee, the books of account of the Ann Arbor Water Company which contain the account of and the gross income and the operating expenses of the said Water Co. for the year of 1899.
