ANN ARBOR, June 18, 1900.

Regular meeting. Called to order by President Seabolt.

Present—Ald. Hamilton, Koch, Rohde, Kearns, Brown, Coon, Jenney, Bliton, Fischer, President Seabolt—10.

Absent — Ald. Richards, Schlenker, Vandawarker, Grose, Weeks—5.

Ald. Hamilton moved to reconsider the payment of Geo. Key's salary for the month of April.

Adopted as follows:

Nays—None.

The minutes of the previous meeting were then approved.

Coon, that the sums of money set down in the lateral sewer abstract of unpaid lateral sewer taxes, also the unpaid paving taxes contained in the paving abstract, is hereby certified to the City Assessor for entrance on the general assessment roll pursuant to law.

To the Common Council.

Gentlemen:—Your committee on Sewers, to whom was referred the matter of a lateral sewer on E. Catherine st., report as follows:

On June the 15th, at eight o'clock p. m., your committee convened at the City Clerk's office and heard all persons interested, appearing and desiring to be heard. No objections being raised to the proposed improvement we recommend that the prayer of the petitioner be granted. We have considered and herewith submit the plans, specifications and estimates of the Engineer and recommend their approval and adoption. We also recommend that the Council pass the necessary resolution declaring the improvement a public necessity in accordance

with the ordinance governing the construction of lateral sewers.

necessity, and that the Board of Public Works be and are hereby ordered to advertise for bids for the construction of said lateral sewer and report the same to the Council.

Ald. Grose petitioned the Council to repair the 5th ward engine house roof. Referred to Fire committee.

Robert Ross presented a bill for damages done by water from Allen's Creek. Referred to Finance committee.

Ald. Brown moved, That they adjourn until next Monday evening at 8 o'clock, local time. Carried.
