R., if changed, to have Main and Packard streets sprinkled and road leveled up; the petition of A. H. Lloyd asking the drainage of a lot between Hill street and Oxford road; petition of Frederick Schmidt et al. for a light on Packard street and Fifth avenue; petition of Caroline Rolf et al. relative to putting West Madison street in condition, were referred to the proper committees.

We also recommend to your honorable body the repairing of the culvert on Main street, Summit and Depot streets and Felch street in the third ward, also on Fifth street, second ward, and repairing the culvert on Liberty street at First street, and also the removal of the 2-foot tile across First emptying into the culvert.

A petition from the property owners along Allen's creek petitioning for new bridge (not culvert) on Felch street and the straightening of the creek, setting bridge a few rods to west, was received and referred to the street committee.

By Ald. Clancy:

Resolved, that the city engineer be directed to notify the M. C. R. R. relative to enlarging their culvert over Allen's creek to suitable dimensions to carry off the water in heavy rains, the one there at present being far too small. Carried.

To the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your committee have had the several matters referred to them under consideration, and would recommend the following:

1. That the culvert across Felch street be enlarged to 14 feet in width,

and that it be built a few rods to the west, and thus be in line for straightening out the creek.

2. That 24-inch tile be laid from the A. A. R. R. track through the Hiscock property and Milling property to the creek, and on Summit street from R. R. property to the creek.

3. That a 24-inch tile be laid on Gott street from Hiscock street to Summit street.

4. That a storm sewer be laid on Thirteenth street from Huron street north to Fuller street.
