Report of Street Committee.

Ann Arbor, Mich., Dec. 7, 1903.

To the Honorable, the Common Council, City of Ann Arbor.

Gentlemen: As to the matter of Pontiac street, which was referred to your committee, beg, leave to report that the city fence in the property of Eli Moore on the west line of Pontiac street. Your committee saw fit that this should be done at once and ordered the same done on the day it was inspected.

Your committee upon inspecting

and also investigating the complaint which was made by W. W. Whitlark, about the city incroaching upon his lands and taking out the gravel which they supposed was in the right of way of opening up Pontiac street, we find that there is a great deal of valuable gravel on Mr. Whitlark's land which will be beneficial to the city, while grading Pontiac street it can be used to good advantage for the city's interest. Would therefore recommend that the city pay to Mr. W. W. Whitlark, through his agent, Norman D. Gates, the sum of One Hundred (100) and 00-100 Dollars, for all the gravel on his property graded to a grade from the corner of Pontiac and Moore to Mill street.

As to the claim of Mr. L. Rohde referred to this committee, would respectfully report that the committee would recommend its disallowance.

While your committee was in session they took up the subject of the city property on the corner of Fifth avenue and Huron street, which is now rented to Mr. Rohde at \$10.00 per month; your committee is of the opinion that this rental is unusually unreasonable for the amount invested in the property and would respectfully recommend that on and after January 1, 1904. the rental of this property should be raised to \$25 a month.
