City of Ann Arbor,  
Gentlemen:

The matter pertaining to the Broadway river street bridge, referred to the street committee beg leave to report the following:

That we recommend that the bridge be raised 3 (three) feet on the South

end, and about 2½ (two and one-half) feet on the North end.

The matter pertaining to Charles street, referred to the street committee, beg leave to report. We are informed that the Engineer of the A. A. Road will be in the city within a few days and that the matter will be taken up with him personally when he gets here, therefore would ask for further time.

We would also recommend that the Board of Public Works with the assistance of the City Engineer be ordered to put the street under the railroad crossings of Miller avenue and Huron and Washington streets into first-class condition, and that as much of the expense as possible be borne by the D. Y. A. A. and Jackson Railway and the A. A. Railway.
