Therefore be it resolved that, and it is hereby determined by this Common Council that it is advisable to lay out, open and establish a street or highway within the City of Ann Arbor described as follows, to-wit: Being in Hiscock's second addition to the said City and the central line thereof to run as follows: Commencing at the south line of Charles street at a point thirty-three rods westerly from the west line of the right of way of the Ann Arbor Railroad Co. as now located. Thence southerly parallel with said right of way to Summit street.

The said street or highway to be four rods wide.

Resolved further that Monday the fourth day of October, 1904 at 7:30 o'clock p. m. at the Council Chambers in the City of Ann Arbor be and is hereby fixed and appointed as the time when and the place where the Common Council will meet to consider the proposed improvement and to hear all persons interested therein.
