Section 134. There shall be a board of public works consisting of five good and competent men who electors. The members of such board shall be appointed by the mayor, subject to the approval of the majority of the members elect of the Common Council, and shall hold office for the term of five years and until their successors are appointed and qualify, the said term to commence on the fifteenth day of May: Provided, That the three members of said board now in office shall continue in office for the terms for which they were arpointed, and until the members of said board provided for by this act shall have been appointed, qualified shall enter upon their duties as members of said board.

Section 135. The members of said board in addition to the three members now composing said board shall be appointed, one for the term of four years and one for the term of five years from the fifteenth day of May, 1905; and said mayor shall annually nominate to the Common Council on the first Monday in May of each year, or as soon thereafter as may be, authorized to employ such assistance

a member of such board for the term of five years, The members of said board shall at their first meeting after the fifteenth day of May of each year, or os soon thereafter as may be, elect one of the members thereof as president of said board, whose duties shall be to call meetings of said board whenever he deems it expedient so to do, or when requested in writing by two or more of the other members of said board, and to preside over the deliberations of said board. And the Common Council shall at all times provide the said board with a suitable office room for its meetings and business uses, and supply record books, stationery and other things necessary for the transaction of the business in charge of said board, and provide for the payment, in like manner as other accounts against the city, of all necessary and lawfol expenses incurred by said board. This act is ordered to take immediate effect.
