Clerk's Report

Gentlemen of the Council—The fore-
going report is made to give you an idea
of the condition of the finances and does
not include the general expenses outside
of present contracts and salaries.
The following approximate estimate
may be of interest. Contingent fund
receipts for the year ending July first
next, outside present appropriation
\$13,323.98. Expenditures outside sal-
aries shown in report \$14,722.19. This
shows a deficit of \$1,398.21. Add this
to deficit shown in report and you will
have a deficit of \$13,893.69 in this fund.
The natural expense of running the fire
department outside of salaries will be
\$2,826.00 for heat, care of horses, etc.
Add this to deficit as shown in report
and you will find the deficit \$7,446.68,

An estimate of \$10,000.00 for crosswalks,
sidewalk grades and general street
work is low. This will show a deficit in
city funds next July of \$21,834.88
without extending yourselves any in
appropriations.

The contingent fund and street fund
should be replenished at once. I rec-
ommend that this report be referred to
a committee consisting of the finance
and ordinance committees, they to be
authorized to call in any assistance they
think best, and said committee to frame
an ordinance in accordance with Section
172 of the Charter.

Whereas, in the opinion of the Council the grade of the sidewalk on the south side of Mosley street ought to be changed and fixed and established, to the end that such street may be suitable for public travel. Therefore

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the grade of the sidewalk on and along the south side of Mosley street from west line of Main street to a point 741 feet west thereof be, and the same

is hereby changed, fixed and established so that the grade of said sidewalk on and along the street aforesaid shall be as follows, that is to say:

At the sw. cor of Main st. 822.85
At 100 ft. west of sw. cor of Main 824.77
At 200 ft. west of sw. cor of Main 828.20
At 300 ft. west of sw. cor of Main 831.60
At 400 ft. west of sw. cor of Main 836.13
At 500 ft. west of sw. cor of Main 839.18
At 600 ft. west of sw. cor of Main 843.10
At 700ft west of sw. cor. of Main 847.45
At 741 ft. west of sw. cor Main 849.57
the elevation given being above the official city datum and along the center line of such walk, and the grade line to consist of straight lines between the several points or stations above stated.
