Gentlemen: Your committee, to whom was referred the matter of taking care of the storm water on the Heinzmann and Laubengayer property, have had the same under consideration and we believe that the city is under no obligation to keep their lateral sewer in repair; but for the protection of the city we believe there should be a gutter constructed along their sidetrack to carry the storm water to Washington street to the storm sewer, providing Heinzman and Laubengayer will consent to the same, details of the agreement to be drawn up by the City Attorney.
