COMMUNICATION FROM MAYOR.
June 7th, 1909.

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—in a former communication to you I wrote of the importance of rebuilding and enlarging the culverts along Allen's creek, and I again desire to recommend that a committee be appointed to investigate which of the culverts should be rebuilt at this time, and the cost of the same. This work should be started as soon as possible, in order that the work will be completed before fall.

As you probably are aware, there is no public drinking fountain in our city, and I would recommend that a committee be appointed to select a suitable location for such a fountain and have the same installed. It is not necessary that it should be a very expensive or elaborate fountain (unless some public spirited citizen should desire to erect one), but one where a person can always secure a drink of cool water. I also believe that there is much need of some kind of a rest room or convenience station in our city, and I desire to suggest that a committee of the Council investigate the feasibility of the city establishing such a station and report back to the council as soon as possible.

To the members of the council who did not attend the meetings of the League of Michigan Municipalities at Flint, I would state that there were several important and interesting papers read at the meetings, and in the discussion of the same a number of valuable ideas were brought out for the improvement of municipal government.
