Gentlemen—Your committee on
sidewalks respectfully recommend the

west side of Walnut street from Ged-
des avenue to S. University avenue
and raise grade; west side of Linden
street from Geddes avenue to S. Uni-
versity avenue; both sides of Seventh
street from Washington street west
to Huron street west; west side of
Eighth street from Breisch's walk
south to and including Estleman's
walk; east side of Eighth street from
W. Washington street south to and in-
cluding Weimer's walk; on south side
of West Washington street from
Eighth street west along Geisendorfer's
and in front of Louis Breisch's
lot; on south side of West Washing-
