#### Mayor's Veto.

Ann Arbor, Mich., July 9th, 1910.

The Honorable Common Council: Gentlemen—I am returning to you, without my approval, so much of the council's proceedings of July 6th, 1910, as relates to your action in concurring in the recommendation of the Board of Public Works relative to awarding the contract for paving East Huron st. and Twelfth st. I am doing this for several reasons, but mainly because the city has shown by the work on Maynard st. and N. Fourth av. that it can lay this kind of pavement much more satisfactorily and at a less price than it can be done by private contract, and I know of no good reason why the city should not continue to do this kind of work, and thereby save the tax payers at least eight hundred dollars on these two streets. Your resolution also makes the city assume the responsibility of the price of cement going higher; that is, the city is to guarantee the contractor that the price of cement he is to use will not cost more than \$1.32 per bbl. Neither does the resolution state at what price the Board of Public Works should let the contract for.

For the above reasons, I therefore disapprove of the resolution directing the Board of Public Works to enter into a contract for paving East Huron st. and Twelfth st., and recommend that the Board of Public Works be directed to lay said pavement.

**Water Committee.**

Ann Arbor, Mich., July 18th, 1910.

To the Honorable the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Water committee have had the petitions for water mains and fire hydrants under consideration and respectfully recommend the following:

That water main be laid on Moseley st., 700 feet from Main st., and fire hydrant be placed at corner of Moseley and First sts. That water main be laid on Summit st., from Gott to Miner sts., and north on Miner st. balance of 700 ft., and fire hydrant be placed at end. That water main be laid on Dewey av., west from Packard st. 700 feet, and fire hydrant be placed at end. That water main be laid on N. Ashley st., from Kingsley to Felch sts., and on Felch st. from N. Main to Ashley sts., and fire hydrant be placed on Ashley st. between Kingsley and Felch sts. That water main be laid on Martin av., 700 feet north from Wells st., and fire hydrant be placed at end. That water main be laid on Hill st., from Oswego st. to intersection of Cambridge road, thence south on Cambridge road until 700 feet have been laid, and fire hydrant be placed at end.

That above mentioned fire hydrants be placed under the direction of the City Engineer.

We further recommend that the petition for fire hydrant at south end of Olivia av. be not granted.
