By Ald. Lutz: Whereas, the common council has been applied to in writing by the owners of a majority of the foot frontage of the lands which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for the grading and paving of South State st. from the south line of Packard st. to the south line of Arch st., within the corporate limits of the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and

Whereas, the grading and paving of that part of State st., within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and hereby declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore,

Resolved, and it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the common council to cause State st., within the limits aforesaid, to be graded and paved under the charter and ordinances of the city of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners.

Resolved, further, that the cost and expense of the construction of said public improvement shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows: All street and public alley intersections, engineering expenses and 20 per cent of the remainder shall be paid by the city, the remainder shall be assessed and paid by special assessment levied and assessed according to the benefits and against all lands, tenements and

premises lying on or fronting State st., within the limits aforesaid.

Resolved, further, that the said petition, along with this determination, be and the same is hereby referred to the Board of Public Works, with directions to report to the council with all convenient dispatch, suitable plans with specifications for the said proposed improvement, the kind and quality of material to be used therefor, together with an estimate of the probable cost and expense of such public improvement.

To the Honorable Common Council, City: Gentlemen—The undersigned, owners of property on South Main and Packard sts., in the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, hereby petition your honorable body to cause South Main st. from the intersection of East William st. to Packard st. and Packard st. from the intersection of South Main st. to Granger av., to be paved. This petition is signed with the understanding and on the condition that the city of Ann Arbor shall pay from general taxation all cost of paving all street intersections, and that the Street Railway Co. occupying said streets shall pave or cause to be paved at their own cost and expense all the parts of the said streets which lie between the outer rails of their said track, and one foot and six inches distance therefrom on the outer side thereof, including switches and turnouts, and that the city of Ann Arbor from general taxation shall pay or cause to be paid 20 per cent of the balance of the said paving.

Your petitioners request that your honorable body cause said streets to be paved with the same kind of paving material as that used on Maynard st., and that now being used on Fourth av.; and that the wires on said streets be placed underground as far as practicable and that the Street Railway Co. and the Washtenaw Light and Power Co. be required to use the same poles, and that the Public Utilities Companies be notified to prepare for said paving.

Proposed Charter Amendment.

By Ald. Manwaring: Resolved, that section 171 of the charter of the city of Ann Arbor be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 171. The common council shall have authority to assess, levy and collect taxes on all the real and personal estate taxable in said city, which tax shall be and remain a lien upon the property so assessed until the same shall be paid; provided, that the aggregate amount which the council may raise by general tax upon the taxable real and personal property for the purposes for which the several general funds are hereinafter constituted shall not, except as herein otherwise provided, exceed in any one year three-fourths of one per cent on the assessed value of all the real and personal property in the city made taxable by law; and provided, further, that nothing herein contained shall be

so construed as to prohibit the common council of said city from regulating by tax or otherwise the business of dealing in malt, spirituous or intoxicating liquors.
