Murray: Resolved, that Wednesday, Oct. 19th, 1910, be and the same is hereby fixed as the date, 2 p. m. the hour, and the council room the place, for the review of the assessment rolls of sewer districts Nos. 32, 34 and 35, and pavement district No. 12. Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Stark, Hochrein, Murray, Staffan, Pipp, Blaich, Goodyear, Paton, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 10. Nays, none. Engineer's Estimate on Paving Alley:

Gentlemen—In accordance with your instructions I herewith submit approximate estimate of the cost of paving with concrete the alley in block 1 north, range 5 east: 294 sq. yards of concrete paving @ \$.80 \$235.20
Superintendence and tools on

above 14.70
 Excavation 25.00

Total cost\$274.90

In my opinion a storm water sewer should be built in this alley to take care of water falling on the roofs of buildings. If immediate action is taken this pavement can be laid this season.

Pipp: Resolved, that the plans, specifications and approximate estimate of the cost of paving alley, running north and south in block 1 north, range 5 east, as presented by the Board of Public Works, be approved and accepted; and the Board of Public Works are hereby authorized to advertise for bids for and proceed with the construction of said pavement according to the charter and ordinances of the city.

Resolved, further, that the construction of said pavement and storm water sewer is deemed and hereby declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Stark, Hochrein, Murray, Staffan, Pipp, Blaich, Goodyear, Paton, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 10. Nays, none.

Resolutions.

By Ald. Lutz: Resolved, that the pavement on E. Huron and Twelfth sts., within the city of Ann Arbor, heretofore ordered, in the opinion of the common council is and is hereby deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Resolved, further, that all the lands, tenements and premises hereinafter mentioned are deemed and declared to be benefited by the construction and completion of the pavement heretofore ordered and it is hereby ordered and determined that all the costs of the said public improvement, street intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of the cost of said public improvement excepted, shall be and is hereby ordered to be levied on and assessed against the lands, tenements and premises situated in the special district assessment hereinafter designated, and the said special assessment district is hereby fixed as follows, to-wit: All those certain pieces and parcels of land situated in the city of Ann Arbor, county of Washtenaw, State of Michigan, as follows:

Boundary for Paving District No. 14.

Lots 1, 2, 3, and the south 84 feet of lot 4, B. 1 N., R. 10 E.; lots 2, 3,

4 and the south 88 feet of lot 1, B. 1 N., R. 11 E.; the south 82 feet of lot 1; the south 82 feet of the west 33 feet of lot 2; the east 33 feet of lot 2; lots 3, 4, 5, B. 1 N., R. 12 E.; and a piece of land 38 feet wide east and west and 132 feet north and south, lying east of and adjacent to lot 5, B. 1 N., R. 12 E.; the west 132 feet of B. 1 S., R. 13 E., city park; lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, B. 2 S., R. 13 E.; the north 132 feet of B. 1 S., R. 10 E. High school; the north 75 feet of lot 1, B. 1 S., R. 11 E.; the north 75 feet of the west 8 feet of lot 2, B. 1 S., R. 11 E.; the east 58 feet of lot 2, B. 1 S., R. 11 E.; lot 3 and the north 52 feet of lot 4, B. 1 S., R. 11 E.; the north 107 feet of B. 1 S., R. 12 E.; also beginning at a point in the west line of Twelfth st. 107 feet south of the southwest corner of E. Huron st. and 12th st.; thence west 132 feet; thence south 50 feet; thence east 44 feet; thence south 107 feet; thence east 88 feet; thence north to the place of beginning. Also beginning at the northwest corner of N. University av. and Twelfth st.; thence west 112 feet; thence north to the south line of lot 11, B. 2 S., R. 12 E.; thence west 66 feet; thence north to the southwest corner of lot 16 in said block; thence east 66 feet; thence north 66 feet; thence east 66 feet to the west line of Twelfth st.; thence southerly along the westerly line of Twelfth st. to the place of beginning.

Resolved, further, that and this common council hereby requires and orders the sum of four thousand, seven hundred nine and 22-100ths (\$4,709.22), payable in ten equal annual installments, with 4 per cent interest, or, at the option of the tax payers, in one payment, to be raised by tax, and a special assessment on and against the lots, parts of lots, lands, tenements aforesaid and situated in the said special assessment district, and as a tax against the owners thereof. All to be assessed on and against said lands, tenements and premises according to the benefits coming to each parcel thereof from such local public improvement, and the city assessor is hereby required to levy and assess the said sum of money as aforesaid on and against the lands and tenements aforesaid on and upon the special assessment roll for the paving district aforesaid and on and upon each and every of the regular assessment rolls of the city of Ann Arbor for the year and during which any such special

assessment may be payable, until the whole of such special assessment shall be paid in full, all to be assessed in the manner and for the purpose aforesaid pursuant to law.

Resolved, further, that the sum of two thousand, five hundred sixty-six and 87-100ths dollars (\$2,566.87) is hereby appropriated for the purpose of defraying the cost of such public improvement at street and alley intersections, and twenty per cent of the balance of costs of said public improvement; all of which sum of money, in ten equal annual installments, with interest, be and the same is hereby ordered and required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the city of Ann Arbor, and on and against all the taxable property within the said city in and during the period in which any part of this appropriation and assessment is or shall be payable.

Resolved, further, that the city clerk do certify this determination and order of assessments to the City Assessor pursuant to law.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Stark, Hochrein, Murray, Staffan, Pipp, Blaich, Goodyear, Paton, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 10. Nays, none.

By Ald. Lutz: Whereas, the common council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of a pavement, known as the East Huron st. pavement, district No. 14, and the common council having caused to be certified to the city assessor the lands, tenements and premises to be assessed for costs of said public improvement, street intersections and twenty per cent of the balance excepted.

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the mayor and the city clerk are hereby authorized and required to execute, under their hands and the seal of the city of Ann Arbor, pavement bonds of the city of Ann Arbor, under date of November 1st, 1910, for seven thousand, two hundred seventy-six and 9-100ths dollars (\$7,276.09), that being the cost of such improvement, payable to bearer in ten equal annual installments from and after the first day of August, 1911, at the office of the city treasurer, with interest at four per cent per annum, payable annually on the first day of August in each and every year, principal to be payable at the option of the city treasurer pursuant to law.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Stark, Hochrein, Murray, Staffan,

Pipp, Blaich, Goodyear, Paton, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 10. Nays, none.

By Ald. Goodyear: Resolved, that the pavement on Fourth av. between Ann and Huron sts., within the city of Ann Arbor, heretofore ordered, in the opinion of the common council is and is hereby deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Resolved, further, that all the lands, tenements and premises hereinafter mentioned are deemed and declared to be benefited by the construction and completion of the pavement heretofore ordered, and it is hereby ordered and determined that all the costs of the said public improvement, street intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of the cost of said public improvement excepted, shall be and is hereby ordered to be levied on and assessed against the lands, tenements and premises situated in the special district assessment hereinafter designated and the said special assessment district is hereby fixed as follows, to-wit: All those certain pieces and parcels of land situated in the City of Ann Arbor, County of Washtenaw, State of Michigan, as follows:

Boundary for Paving District No. 13.

The east 1-2 of block 1 north, range 4 east; the west 100 feet of block 1 north, range 5 east;

Resolved, further, that and this common council hereby requires and orders the sum of one thousand, eighty-one and 7-100ths dollars (\$1,081.07), payable in ten equal annual installments, with four per cent interest, or, at the option of the tax payers, in one payment, to be raised by tax and a special assessment on and against the lots, parts of lots, lands, tenements aforesaid and situated in the said special assessment district, and as a tax against the owners thereof. All to be assessed on and against said lands, tenements and premises according to the benefits coming to each parcel thereof from such local public improvement, and the city assessor is hereby required to levy and assess the said sum of money as aforesaid on and against the lands and tenements aforesaid on and upon the special assessment roll for the paving district aforesaid and on and upon each and every of the regular assessment rolls of the city of Ann Arbor for the year and during which any such special assessment may be payable, until the whole of such special assessment shall be paid

in full, all to be assessed in the manner and for the purpose aforesaid pursuant to law.

Resolved, further, that the sum of two hundred seventy and 27-100ths dollars (\$270.27) is hereby appropriated for the purpose of defraying the cost of such public improvement at street and alley intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of costs of said public improvement; all of which sum of money in ten equal annual installments, with interest, be and the same is hereby ordered and required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the city of Ann Arbor, and on and against all the taxable property within the said City in and during the period in which any part of this appropriation and assessment is or shall be payable.

Resolved, further, that the city clerk do certify this determination and order of assessments to the City Assessor pursuant to law.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Stark, Hochrein, Murray, Staffan, Pipp, Blaich, Goodyear, Paton, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 10. Nays, none.

By Ald. Goodyear: Whereas, the common council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of a pavement, known as the Fourth av. pavement, district No. 13, and the common council having caused to be certified to the city assessor

the lands, tenements and premises to be assessed for costs of said public improvement, street intersections and twenty per cent of the balance excepted.

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the Mayor and the city clerk are hereby authorized and required to execute, under their hands and the seal of the city of Ann Arbor, pavement bonds of the city of Ann Arbor under date of November 1st, 1910, for one thousand, three hundred fifty-one and 34-100ths dollars (\$1,351.34), that being the cost of such improvement, payable to bearer in ten equal annual installments from and after the first day of August, 1911, at the office of the city treasurer, with interest at four per cent per annum, payable annually on the first day of August in each and every year, principal to be payable at the option of the city treasurer pursuant to law.

Adopted as follows: Yeas, Ald. Stark, Hochrein; Murray, Staffan, Pipp, Blaich, Goodyear, Paton, Lutz, Pres. Mills, 10. Nays, none.

Moved by Ald. Lutz: That a committee of one alderman from each ward be appointed to present to the public a thorough explanation of the proposed charter amendments to be voted on November 8th. Adopted, and Ald. Lutz, O'Connor, Murray, Sweet, Flynn, Sherk and Goodyear appointed as such committee.
