Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Manwaring presented the following ordinance, which was given its third reading:

An ordinance to amend an ordinance entitled "An ordinance relative to street pavements," passed July 7, 1897; approved July 12, 1897.

The common council of the city of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1. That section 14 of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Relative to Street Pavements," passed July 7, 1897, approved July 12, 1897, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 14.* After the confirmation of any such special assessment roll, it shall be the duty of the city clerk to certify the said assessment roll, together with the resolution of confirmation, to the city assessor, who shall forthwith attach thereto his warrant directed to the city treasurer, commanding him to collect from all, each and every of the persons assessed in said special assessment roll, the sum of money assessed to and set opposite his name therein. The said taxes or assessment shall become payable and due in ten equal annual installments; the first installment in the month of July next after any such assessment roll shall have been confirmed, along with the city taxes, and an

nually thereafter until fully paid. All of the said taxes or assessments shall draw interest annually from the date of the confirmation of any such assessment roll, at the rate of five per cent per annum, until paid. Any such person against whom any such tax or assessment shall have been assessed shall have leave and be at liberty to pay the same, or any installment thereof, at any one payment at any time after such assessment roll shall have been certified to the city treasurer, with interest from the date of confirmation only: Provided, That at any time after a special assessment has become payable, the same may be collected by suit in the name of the city against the person assessed, in an action of assumpsit, in any court having jurisdiction of the amount. In every such action, a declaration upon the common counts for money paid shall be sufficient. The special assessment roll and a certified order or resolution confirming the same shall be "prima facie" evidence of the regularity of all the proceedings in making the assessment, and the right of the city to recover judgment therefor.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.

Sewer Committee.

By Ald. Sherk: Whereas, the city of Ann Arbor did on or about the 6th day of November, A. D. 1893, secure from Mrs. Elizabeth Sweet the right to lay a certain city sewer pipe upon and across her property, known as No. 118 Felch st., and

Whereas, the said city agreed to make all sewer connections required on said property as compensation for the above privilege granted by Elizabeth Sweet to the city, and

Whereas, the city has not fully completed its part of the agreement, therefore be it

Resolved, that the City Engineer be instructed and given power to have such connections made as will fully comply with the terms of the agreement with Elizabeth Sweet.

Street Committee.

To the Honorable Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Street committee,

to whom was referred the request of the Board of Regents of the University of Michigan to vacate that part of East Huron st. lying between Fourteenth and Observatory sts., recommend that the offer of the Board of Regents, as made by its communications of Sept. 29, 1909, and Oct. 18, 1910, and the plan as shown by the blue print sketch by O. C. Simonds, dated Sept., 1910, be accepted.

And, further, we recommend that the petition to have the said above part of East Huron st. vacated be granted, and that the City Clerk notify the Board of Regents of the action of the Common Council.

Resolved, further, that Monday, the 6th day of February, 1911, at 7 o'clock p. m. of said day, is hereby fixed and appointed as the time when, and the common council chamber in the city of Ann Arbor, Mich., as the place, where the common council will meet to consider the proposed improvement and to hear all persons interested therein.

Resolved, further, that the city clerk do give notice, in accordance with the city charter, to all persons interested therein of the pending of the question of ordering the said improvement.
