Sidewalk Grade Resolution.

By Ald. Rash: Whereas, in the opinion of the Council the grade of the sidewalk on the west side of Brown st. ought to be changed and fixed and established to the end that such street may be suitable for public travel therefore.

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered that the grade of the sidewalk on and along the west side of Brown st. from the north line of Philip st. to the south line of Stoll av. be, and the same is hereby changed, fixed and established so that the grade of said sidewalk on and along the street aforesaid shall be as follows, that is to say:

At the north line of Philip st....	842.16
At the south line of Stoll av....	835.20
B. M. on hyd. at cor. Main and Hill, El	839.34
B. M. on hyd. at cor. Philip and Brown, El.	842.72

The elevation given being above the official city datum and along the center line of such walk, and the grade lines to consist of straight lines between the several points or stations above stated.

Chiefs and one Engineer each \$77.00 per month; two Captains each \$73.00 per month; all second year or longer Firemen \$70.00 each per month; all first year Firemen each \$60.00 per month; and two attendants each \$46.00 per month.
