This is about the way the budget for next year will have to be made up under the present charter arrangement. You will rotice that there is no money placed in the street and sidewalk funds and of course the amounts necessary for street repairs and cleaning, sidewalk grading, care of horses, etc., will have to be transferred from the bridge, culvert and crosswalk

fund. The fees from the city clerk and treasurer together with the saloon and liquor licenses will help out the contingent fund. The amount in the several funds will just about take care of contracts already made, and specific improvements can come only when the people vote money therefor.

The natural increase in expenses, such as street lights, hydrants, water, care of storm water, grading of sidewalks, repair of streets, cleaning paved streets, etc., outstrips the increase in assessments, and as the amount of money the city can raise by tax for the regular city funds according to the charter will not be sufficient to carry out the wishes of some of our citizens as to improvements thought necessary. I recommend that the council provide money for same before any new contracts, carrying with them an expenditure of money within the next year, are signed.
