3. That the board of public works employ a suitable man for pavement construction in order to relieve the street commissioner so that he can devote his time attending to necessary street repairs and other work about the city.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your committee, appointed to investigate the matter of insurance of city employes, reports as follows: that all employes of the city under contract or hire, expressed or implied, oral or written, are included in the Workman's Compensation and Employers' Liability Acts. Also those holding office or employed under appointment.

The rates on the various classes of employes are as follows: Policemen and firemen \$5.50 per hundred, with a minimum of \$20.00 per annum per man. The pay roll for police and firemen will amount to almost \$24,000.00 for the current year.

A rate of \$1.75 is made for the following employes: city treasurer, city attorney, city physician, health officer, poor commissioner, sanitary policeman, sexton Fairview cemetery and janitor of city building. The pay roll for the above officers will amount to almost \$5,500.00 for the current year.

The rate of those employed in the capacity of clerks is seventeen cents per hundred.

We respectfully recommend that the city take out insurance on all of the above employes.
