From Water Department—

To the Honorable Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor: Gentlemen—In view of the fact of the paving of Church st. in the near future, the Water Works department feels that larger pipe must be laid and connections made. An expenditure of about \$1,500.00 is needed by the said department for the purchase of pipes, gates and fittings. The Water Works department is anxious that the work pertaining to this matter be completed before the city commences paving, and not having sufficient funds on hand most respectfully request that this matter be taken care of by your Honorable Body.

We have an exceedingly low price on 6-in. pipe, much lower than ever quoted, providing we can purchase the said pipe by March 20. In all probabilities we will have enough money on hand to pay for the pipe when delivered, but as the ordinance will not allow us to make contracts unless we have the money on hand, we are obliged to make this request. From Board of Park Commissioners -
Ann Arbor, Mich., March 13th, 1914.

To the Honorable Mayor and Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan: Gentlemen—Attached here-

to is a copy of a resolution passed at a meeting of the Board of Park Commissioners, held March 11th, 1914, in reference to the purchase of a piece of land at the corner of Washtenaw and Baldwin avenues. The residents in that vicinity have subscribed to a fund amounting to four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00), which they will give to the city towards the purchase of this property on which they have an option, expiring April 1st, for the sum of fifty-five hundred ninety and 68.100 dollars (\$5,590.68). We feel that the generosity of these people in giving to the city four thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) for this property, should not be overlooked. This property, situated, as it is, on one of the main entrances to Ann Arbor, if improved, cannot but attract much attention and be a great addition to the beauty of the city. The piece contains somewhat over an acre of land, and compared with the value of other property in that vicinity, we do not feel the price is excessive. Should the option be allowed to expire, there is every indication that part of this land will be sold at once, thus ruining any chances of its use for public purposes in the future. We therefore, urge the action recommended in the attached resolution.

Whereas, the residents in the vicinity of a triangular piece of land bounded by Washtenaw avenue, Baldwin avenue and Cambridge road, have offered to purchase this piece of land for the sum of fifty-five hundred ninety 68.100 dollars (\$5,590.68), and to sell the same to the city for a park for the sum of fifteen hundred ninety 68.100 dollars (\$1,590.68), payable not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per year, with interest at five percent on the unpaid balance.

Resolved, that we recommend to the Common Council that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to make a contract for the purchase of this property on the terms mentioned.

From Business Men on Lighting streets—

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—We, the undersigned committee, appointed by the Merchants' Credit association and Business Men's club of the city of Ann Arbor, composed of one hundred

and fifty-three business men, respectfully ask your consideration of the following street lighting plan:

We, the business men of Ann Arbor, propose to raise fifteen thousand dollars, or thereabouts, to install one hundred and twenty-two boulevard posts carrying five electric lights each four forty watt, and one sixty watt on top of post, similar to exhibit "A" attached hereto. These posts are to be located in the business district as per exhibit "B," attached hereto, on condition that the City of Ann Arbor will maintain same. Maintenance will cost at a rough estimate:

122 posts at \$27.00 per year \$3,294.00
 To take place of 17 arc lights that are in present use at \$60.00 1,020.00

Net increase of maintenance \$2,274.00

We believe that this lighting system will be a great advantage to the city of Ann Arbor, and do more than anything else to beautify the city. All wiring to be underground.

Two strips of land each being 132 feet deep, lying on both sides of and adjoining West Liberty street, and being bounded east by a north and south line which is 1070 feet, along the center line of West Liberty street, west of the west line of Eighth street, and on the west by the city limits.
