If cement grout filler could be used a much better pavement would be obtained and the cost would be about 10c per sq. yd. or \$250.00 less.

Sewer Committee.

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your sewer committee has had the following matter under consideration, and recommend that Mr. Wm. H. Murray be permitted to change the course of creek on city water works property, near receiving well at station No. 2, under the direction of the city engineer and water commissioners. I. L. Sherk, Chairman of Sewer Committee.

Ald. Sherk moved the adoption of the report. Adopted by unanimous vote.

Street Committee.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Street committee, to whom the following matters were referred, respectfully recommend as follows:

That the width of roadway on Arch st., between Oakland ave. and Packard st., be fixed and established at twenty-eight feet.

That Martin Place be graded, and

the excavated material used for sidewalk and lawn extension filling on east side of said st.

That the width of the roadway on Fair Oaks parkway be fixed and established at thirty feet, and the width of roadway on Norway road at twenty-four feet.

That the gutter on south side of Kingsley st., opposite the Catholic church, be filled, so as to throw the water to the north side of said street.

That Madison st. be graveled from Third st. west 150 feet, and W. Washington st. be graveled from Ashley st. to the Ann Arbor railroad, and new crosswalk be constructed on east side of First st. across Washington st.

That cement extensions be built at corner of Hill st. and Oxford road as follows: One at S. W. corner running east from sidewalk, and one at N. W. corner; also replace the brick extensions at said intersection with cement, two at N. E. corner, two at S. E. corner, and one at S. W. corner.

That about twenty feet of sewer pipe be laid in gutter on the south side of Madison st., near the Ann Arbor railroad track.

That the council does not accept deed to Woodlawn ave. until water is properly taken care of and the street properly graded by the property owners.

Sidewalk Committee.

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your sidewalk committee has had the following matters under consideration, and recommend that new cement walks be constructed on West Huron st. in front of No. 914; on North State st. in front of No. 411; on Kingsley st. in front of No. 333; and around the property at the corner of Kingsley and Division sts. (both streets southwest corner); on the south side of Kingsley st. along property of Dr. Burke; on East Huron st. from No. 1115 to 1131 and from 1131 to 14th st.; on 14th st. from Huron st. to 1119; on Broadway along Nos. 1007-9-11-24 and 30; on west side of Crest ave. entire length; on N.

Division st. along 4th ward school property.

Repair walks 1425 Cambridge road; 1117 Packard st.; on north side of Fuller st. near Detroit st.; on Broadway along No. 1027, 1109 and in front of John Shadford property.

Construct extension on Broadway at northeast corner of Wall st. and build a crosswalk on Pontiac st. across both sides of railroad property, all of which is hereby deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Lighting Committee.

To the Council: Gentlemen — Your lighting committee has had the following lights under consideration, and recommends that tungsten street lights be placed as follows: One on Traver st. across from No. 1137; three on Cedar st. between Wright st. and Boulevard; one on the east side of 4th st. between Jefferson and Madison sts.; and one on the east side of Hamilton place between William and Jefferson sts. We also recommend that an arc light be placed at the west end of Cedar st., and also one at the corner of S. University ave. and Church st., the tungsten light at this locality to be moved to one of the above named positions.

Ald. Hubbard moved the adoption of the report. Adopted by unanimous vote.

Bond Committee.

Ald. Sink presented the plumber's bond of E. L. Schneider as principal, and Oswald Dietz and Jacob Eschelbach as sureties, and moved that same be adopted. Adopted by unanimous vote.

Special Committee.

By Ald. Groves: Resolved, that the Board of Education of the Public Schools of the city of Ann Arbor be and is hereby permitted to install, operate, maintain and own in the public streets a 12 inch extension of the University high pressure fire protection system, from its present terminal on the Hill Auditorium property adjoining South Thayer st., along said South Thayer st. to the south line of East Huron st., to pro-

vide better protection from fire for the High school and Public library buildings; it being understood that it is the intent to install 8 inch high pressure hydrants on the east side of South Thayer st., one at the N. E. corner of Washington st., and one at the S. E. corner of Huron st., and that a 12 inch cross will be installed at the intersection of South Thayer and East Washington sts., and a 12 inch by 12 inch by 8 inch tee at the Huron st. terminal to provide for future extensions.

Adopted by unanimous vote.

By Ald. Groves: Whereas, the Board of Education has received a proposition for installing an extension of the University high pressure fire protection system, in accordance with the above resolution, for the sum of \$2,737.00, and,

Whereas, it is proposed to install the same under the same specifications, and the above mentioned price is on the same basis as the University built its extension to the University hospital, and

Whereas, the said proposed extension will afford the same fire protection to all property within several blocks of each hydrant, as is now provided for the University buildings, therefore be it

Resolved, that the Common Council of the city of Ann Arbor authorize the payment of 25 per cent of the expense of the installation of the said extension out of the city treasury.
