To the Finance committee of the Common Council: Gentlemen—I have examined the foregoing accounts against the city of Ann Arbor, and I hereby certify that they are correct to the best of my knowledge.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Finance committee has reviewed the foregoing report. Warrants for salaries were drawn August 1, 1914. We recommend that same be approved and that warrants be ordered drawn for the foregoing accounts.

GEO. LUTZ, E. W. GROVES, ALBERT FIEGFL, Finance Committee.

Ald. G. Lutz moved the adoption of the report. Adopted by unanimous vote.

Ald. Geo. Lutz presented the bill of Hochrein & Co., amounting to \$141.30, for plumbing at Seventh ward building, and moved that it be allowed and warrant drawn for same. Adopted by unanimous vote.

Ald. Geo. Lutz presented second estimate on contract with John Koch for shelter house at Island park, amount due \$456.00, and moved that same be allowed and warrant ordered drawn. Adopted by unanimous vote.

**Ordinance Committee.**

Ald. Sink presented an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance to amend 'an ordinance relative to fire limits and fires,'" which was given its first reading by title and referred to Ordinance committee by unanimous vote of council.

Ald. Sink presented the following ordinance for its third reading:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO PARKS, BOULEVARDS AND LAWN EXTENSIONS WITHIN THE CITY OF ANN ARBOR, MICHIGAN," passed October 7th, 1907; approved October 16th, 1907.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:—

Sec. 1. That section 15 of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance relative to parks, boulevards and lawn extensions within the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan," passed October 7th, 1907; approved October 16th, 1907, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 15.—No person shall pile any materials, implements, merchandise or boxes upon any lawn extension within the limits of the City of Ann Arbor, without first receiving written permission from the Board of Park Commissioners, nor shall any person wearing spiked or cleated shoes stand or walk upon any lawn extensions or lawns within said limits.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after ten days from legal publication.

The Chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?" Passed by unanimous vote.

**Sewer Committee.**

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your sewer committee have had the following matters under consideration, and recommend that the petition of Evert Scott and others, asking permission to lay a sanitary sewer in Fair Oaks Parkway and across private property from a point 200 feet south of Norway road to a connection with a sewer in Austin ave., and also a sanitary sewer across private property to a manhole in Austin ave., be granted.

We further recommend that the matter of a storm sewer on Cambridge road be referred to the finance committee and engineer to report back to the council.

We also recommend that a sanitary sewer be built on Moore st., as per recommendation of the health officer, from Broadway to Pontiac sts. and the city engineer furnish necessary plans, specifications and approxi-

mate estimate of the cost of said improvement with all convenient dispatch. All of which is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

I. L. Sherk, Geo. Lutz, Julius H. Koernke, Thos. Hanselmann, Sam Heusel, Sewer Committee.

Ald. Sherk moved the adoption of the report, which was adopted by unanimous vote.

Moved by Ald. Markey, that the matter of sanitary sewer on Hill st., between Oswego st. and city limits, as presented by Mr. Stivers, be referred to Sewer and Street committee for investigation. Adopted.

#### Street Committee.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your street committee has had the following matters under consideration and respectfully recommend:

That Weinberg plat be accepted on condition—1st, that City gets deed of right of way twelve feet wide along storm water sewer; 2nd, that Mr. Weinberg grade for and build cement walks along both sides of the streets shown on said plat.

That the two driveways on west side of Fifth ave. between Liberty st. and William st. be raised by the City.

That the width of driveway on Cambridge road between Forest ave. and Washtenaw ave. be made twenty-four feet.

#### Police Committee.

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your police committee, to whom the Mayor's recommendation that the police force be increased by one and that a patrolman be permanently stationed in the Fifth ward was referred, recommends that recommendation be concurred in; that police force be increased to ten, including the chief, and that one patrolman be stationed in the Fifth ward continually

Ald. A. Lutz moved the adoption of the report.
