Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Sink presented the following ordinance, for its third reading:

An Ordinance to amend an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance prohibiting persons under sixteen years of age from being in the streets, alleys or public places in the City of Ann Arbor after certain hours of the night," passed March 3rd, 1913; approved March 13th, 1913.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain.

Section 1. That section 4 of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance prohibiting persons under sixteen years of age from being in the streets, alleys or public places in the City of Ann Arbor after certain hours of the night," passed March 3rd, 1913; approved March 13th, 1913, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 4. That the blowing of the chime whistle at the West Washington street pumping station of the Water Works department of the City of Ann Arbor, or at such other place as the Council may designate, shall be the sounding of the curfew hour. The failure to sound the curfew signal shall not be a defence to any action brought for a violation of this ordinance.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after ten days from legal publication.

The chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"

Also that Tungsten light now at corner of East University and Monroe st. be moved to opposite side of street.

Your committee met with Mr. James H. Marks, Supt. of University grounds, and he has agreed to place, without cost to city, three Tungsten lights under the overhead bridge at E. Washington st., an arc Tungsten at both Huron and Ann sts., where their spur track crosses said streets, and an arc Tungsten on Catherine st., about half way between Glen ave. and entrance to University hospital. Moved by Ald. Markey, that the street commissioner give home people employment in preference to others. Adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 14.

Moved by Ald. Hanselmann, that Fifth st. south of Madison st. be accepted by the city. Adopted by unanimous vote of those present, 14.
