To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Sewer committee has had the petition of J. P. Judson for sanitary sewer on Roosevelt ave., from Church st. to Forest ave., under consideration, and respectfully recommend that petition be granted and sewer be ordered built.

Street Committee.

To the Council: Gentlemen—Your Street committee have had the following matters under consideration and recommend:

1st. That all concrete and asphalt pavement be tarred as fast as it can be done.

2nd. That 4th and 7th streets be graveled, from Liberty to Jefferson sts., the east half of Broadway be graveled from river bridge to Viaduct, and Detroit st. graveled the entire length.

3rd. That a gutter box be constructed on the west side of Gott st., across Hiscock st.; one across Summit st., on the west side of Gott st.; and one on the southwest corner of State and Lawrence sts.

4th. That Michigan Central Railroad Company be notified to plank between their rails and on each side of the Ann Arbor Machine Company's side-track, where it crosses Broadway.

5th. That the width of roadway on Linden st. be fixed at twenty-four feet, and the width of roadway on Pontiac st. be fixed at thirty-four feet.

6th. That tile be constructed across East Catherine st., at 12th st., to care for water on the south side of Catherine st.

7th. That gutters be raised and gutter boxes be removed from east and west side of Hamilton place, at the corner of East William st., under the supervision of the Board of Public Works.
