Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Albert Lutz presented an or-
dinance entitled:

An ordinance to amend section
twenty-five and repeal section twen-
ty-six, of an ordinance entitled, "An
Ordinance relative to Parks, Boule-
vards and Lawn Extensions, within
the City of Ann Arbor"; passed Octo-
ber 7th, 1907, approved Octo-
ber 16th, 1907; amended May 2nd,
1910; amended August 3d, 1914.

The Common Council of the City
of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1. That section twenty-five of
an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance
relative to Parks, Boulevards and
Lawn Extensions within the city of
Ann Arbor, passed October 7th,
1907; approved October 16th, 1907;
be and the same is hereby amended
to read as follows:

Sec. 25. On the drive known as
"Cedar Bend Drive," vehicles must
enter from Broadway and go down
hill past Island and exit at Wall
street bridge, EXCEPT, that vehicles
may enter at Wall street bridge and
go as far as the Island shelter in the
opposite direction. On Glen drive
vehicles shall enter from Geddes ave-
nue or from Observatory street, at
the Observatory, and go down hill
along the river and exit on Fuller
street at the foot of Observatory
street hill.

Sec. 2. That section twenty-six of
said ordinance be and the same is
hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take
effect and be in force from and after
ten days from legal publication,
which was given its first reading by
title, passed to and given its second
reading and referred to Ordinance
committee by following vote:

partment, or the fire department, of
the city of Ann Arbor.

The Common Council of the city
of Ann Arbor ordain:

Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, other than an employee of the water works department or fire department of the city of Ann Arbor, through himself or his agent, by false key or otherwise, after the water has been cut off from any premises, to cause or suffer the water from the water works system of the city of Ann Arbor to be turned on to any such premises, or to in any way cause any premises to be supplied with water without a permit from the water works department of said city.

Sec. 2. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars, nor more than twenty-five dollars, and costs of prosecution; and in default of the payment of such fine, such person or persons shall be imprisoned in the Washtenaw County jail until such fine and costs are paid, not exceeding thirty days.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after ten days from legal publication, which was given its first reading by title, passed to and given its second reading, and referred to Ordinance committee, by following vote:

**West Catherine and Miller Ave.,
Pavement Boundary, And Or-
der of Assessment.**

By Ald. O. Mayer: Resolved, that the pavement on W. Catherine st. and Miller ave., within the City of Ann Arbor, heretofore ordered, in the opinion of the Common Council is and is hereby deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Resolved, further, that all the lands, tenements and premises hereinafter mentioned are deemed and declared to be benefitted by the construction and completion of the pavement heretofore ordered, and it is hereby ordered and determined that all the costs of the said public improvement, street intersections and twenty percent of the balance of the cost of said public improvement excepted, shall be and is hereby ordered to be levied on and assessed against the lands, tenements and premises situated in the special district assessment hereinafter designated and the said special assessment district is hereby fixed as follows, to-wit:

All those certain pieces and parcels of land situated in the City of Ann Arbor, County of Washtenaw, State of Michigan, as follows:

Original Plat of Ann Arbor:

Block 2 north, range 3 east: Lot 4, the west 58 feet of lot 5 and the north 18 ft. of the east 66 ft. of lot 5.

Block 2 north, range 2 east: Lots 4 and 5.

Block 2 north, range 1 east: The north 49 1-2 ft. of the east 66 ft. and the north 82 1-2 ft of the re-

mainder of said block and range which extends west to Allen's creek.

Block 3 north, range 2 east: Lots 1, 2 and 16.

Block 3 north, range 3 east: Lots 1 and 16 and the east 77 ft. of lot 2.

Unplotted land lying between Allen's creek and the east line of Chapin's addition, and extending from Miller ave. south to a line parallel with and 82 1-2 ft. south of the south line of West Catherine st.

Chapin Addition:

Lot 1 and a strip of land of equal depth between lot 1 and the old Mill race or east line of Chapin addition. The northerly 99 ft. of lots 2 and 3 and of that part of lot 4 lying east of Chapin street.

That part of lot 19 lying east of Gott st, excepting that piece including the northwest corner of said lot 19 now owned by the Sickelsteel Lumber Co. and fronting 120 ft. on Gott street and about 75 ft. on Felch st., and measuring about 140 ft. on the east line. Lots 20, 21 and 22.

A strip of land abutting lots 20, 21, and 22, of Stocking's add. on the northerly side, same being 84 ft. wide and extending from Felch st., to the east line of said Stocking's add.

A strip of land fronting on the north side of Miller ave., between the east line of Stocking's add., along which its depth is 245 ft. and the west line of Fountain st, along which its depth is 219 ft.

Douglas, McOmber and Ryan's Sub-division of Block 4 Felch's Add:

Lots 1, 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, and 12.

Block 5: the southerly part of lot 4, being 55 ft. long on the west side where it adjoins Spring st., and about 90 ft. long on the east line.

Resolver, further, that and this Common Council hereby requires and orders the sum of \$15,910.00, payable in ten equal annual installments, with four per cent interest or, at the option of the tax payers, in one payment, to be raised by tax and a special assessment on and against the lots, parts of lots, lands, tenements aforesaid and situated in the said special assessment district, and as a tax against the owners thereof. All to be assessed on and against said lands, tenements and premises according to the benefits coming to each parcel thereof from such local public improvement, and the City Assessor is hereby required to levy and assess the said sum of money as aforesaid on and against the lands and tenements aforesaid on and upon the special assessment roll for the paving district aforesaid and on and upon each and every of the regular assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor for the year and during which any such special assessment may be payable, until the whole of such special assessment shall be paid in full, all to be assessed in the manner and for the purpose aforesaid pursuant to law.

Resolved, further, that the sum of \$8020.00 is hereby appropriated for the purpose of defraying the cost of such public improvement at street and alley intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of costs of said public improvement; all of which sum of money in ten equal annual installments, with interest, be and the same is hereby ordered and required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the City of Ann Arbor, and on and against all the taxable property within the said city in and during the period in which any part of this appropriation and assessment is or shall be payable.

Resolved, further, that the City Clerk to certify this determination and order of assessments to the City Assessor pursuant to law.

Adopted by the following vote: Yea, Ald. Fiegel, Heusel, A. Lutz, Mayer, Heck, Andres, Flynn, Donnelly, Manwaring, Freeman McGregor, Geo. Lutz, 12. Nays, none.

Pavement Bonds.

By Ald. O. R. Mayer: Whereas, the

Common Council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of a pavement, known as the W. Catherine st. and Miller ave. Pavement, District No. 36, and the Common Council having caused to be certified to the City Assessor the lands tenements and premises to be assessed for costs of said public improvement, street intersections and twenty per cent of the balance excepted.

Resolved, and it is hereby ordered, that the Mayor and the City Clerk are hereby authorized and required to execute, under their hands and the seal of the City of Ann Arbor, pavement bonds of the City of Ann Arbor, under date of August 16, 1916, for \$23,930.00, that being the cost of such improvement, payable to bearer in ten equal annual installments from and after the first day of August, 1917, at the office of the City Treasurer, with interest at four per cent per annum, payable annually on the first day of August in each and every year, principal to be payable at the option of the City Treasurer pursuant to law.

By Ald. Heck: Resolved, that the City Attorney be and he is hereby directed to obtain deeds to the property adjoining Felch st. south side, between Fountain and Gott st., so that said street may be widened.

Resolved further, that the street Commissioner be ordered to fill the portion of said street above described.

Ald. Heusel moved that the matter be referred to the Street committee with power to act, which was adopted by following vote: Yeas, Ald. Fiegel, Heusel, A. Lutz, Mayer, Heck, Andres, Flynn, Donnelly, Manwaring, Freeman, McGregor, Geo. Lutz, 12. Nays, none..

By Ald. Geo. Lutz: Resolved, that the Water Commissioners be authorized to purchase \$25,000.00 of City Bonds, toward creating a sinking fund for retirement of Waterworks Bonds as they become due.

By Ald Manwaring: Resolved, that

the city clerk make all necessary arrangements according to law for the general primary election to be held Aug. 29, 1916.

Resolved, further, that said election be held in the several ward voting places as follows: 1st ward, voting room, basement of City Hall; 2nd ward, voting room, Ward Building on S. Ashley st; 3rd ward, Ward Building on Miller ave.; 4th ward, in basement of New Armory on 5th ave.; 5th ward, Ward Building, cor. Swift and Pontiac streets; 6th ward, Basement Tappan School, East University avenue; 7th ward, Ward Building on Mary st.

Moved by Ald. Fiegel, that the front room in basement of City Hall, formerly occupied by Police Dept. be hereafter used for registration and elections purposes for the 1st ward, and the City Clerk be authorized to make all necessary changes.

Adopted by following vote: Yeas, Ald. Fiegel, Heusel, A. Lutz, Mayer, Heck, Andres, Flynn, Donnelly, Manwaring, Freeman, McGregor, Geo. Lutz, 12. Nays, none.
