Street Committee.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Street committee has had the following matters under consideration and respectfully recommend:

(1) That crosswalk be built across E. University ave., along south side of Vaughn st.

(2) That crosswalk be built across State st., at south end of Ferry Field wall.

(3) That crosswalk be built across E. Ann st., between Ingalls st. and Glen ave.

(4) That rip-rap and filling be placed on E. side of Broadway just north of culvert over creek.

(5) That railing be extended along east side of Traver st., past the Koch gravel pit, and existing railing be repaired.

(6) That railing be built along Swift st., past the dangerous part of Argo race embankment.

(7) That matter of fire protection for Newton Haggerty Ladder Co., be referred to Water Commissioners.

All crosswalks to be constructed, under supervision of City Engineer.

Relative to the matter of street leading to Newton Haggerty Ladder Co., we find that the city has no jurisdiction, as the same is outside of the city limits.

Lighting Committee.

To the Honorable, the Common Council: Gentlemen—Your Lighting committee respectfully recommends that street lights be placed as follows:

Place a tungsten light on Miller ave., at the intersection of Fountain st., on the south side of Miller ave.

Place an arc light on Division st., at the intersection of John st., in the middle of Division st.

Place a tungsten light on Washington st., at the intersection of Ninth st., place on the south side of Washington st.

Arc light on Catherine st., at intersection of Clark st.; tungsten light now there be removed.

Put arc light on Granger ave., at the intersection of Forest ave.; remove tungsten light now there, and place it 450 ft. east on Granger ave., on the north side of the st.

Arc light now at intersection of Granger and Packard sts. be removed 25 ft. north on Packard, parallel with car line.
