#### Ordinance Committee.

Ald. Sink presented the following ordinance, which was given its third reading:

An Ordinance to amend an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance relative to Licenses," passed July 6, 1891; approved July 15, 1891; amended February 4, 1895; amended March 16, 1896; amended December 19, 1898; amended June 4, 1900; amended November 6, 1905; amended June 17, 1907; amended January 6, 1908.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1. That section seven of an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance relative to Licenses," passed July 6, 1891; approved July 15, 1891; amended January 6, 1908, be and the same is hereby made to read as follows:

Section 7. Every hawker, peddler or person going about from place to place or who makes use of any of the streets or open places in said city, selling or offering for sale goods, wares, merchandise or any species of property, shall pay a license in the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per year, or fifty dollars (\$50.00) for six months. And for a period less than six months, such person shall pay a license therefor as follows: That is to say, if he intends to travel on foot, \$3.00; if he intends to travel with one horse or more, \$5.00 for every vehicle used. Any person selling or offering for sale any property from any wagon, hand-cart, show-case, window or stand in any street or open place shall pay the sum of \$10.00 per day; and in granting licenses for any such purpose, in any street or open place, the Mayor may designate where any such wagon, hand-cart, stand or show case shall be located, and shall have the power to change and relocate the same from time to time at his discretion; provided, that any resident of the city of Ann Arbor, having a bona fida residence in said city for a period of at least six months prior to the time of making application for a license, may obtain a license by the payment of \$25.00 for a six months period, for the purpose of selling, and peddling, dairy,

farm and garden produce. Provided, further, this section shall not apply to persons selling meat, domestic fruit, dairy, farm or garden produce (of their own raising and production), nor to bakers or merchants delivering goods to their customers.

Section 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance is to take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.

The chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"

Sink presented an ordinance entitled: "An ordinance to license public carriages, omnibusses, hacks, cabs, automobiles, taxicabs, and to prescribe the rights and duties of the owners and drivers thereof. The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain," which was given its first reading by title, passed to and given its second reading and referred to the Ordinance committee by the following vote: Yeas, Ald. Sugden, Mayer, Huss, Henderson, Donnelly, Markey, Hauser, McGregor, Freeman, Lutz, Sink, President Reichert, 12. Nays, none.

#### Street Committee Report.

Whereas, we, the undersigned, owners of the following described lands: Commencing at a point 10 rods north of the center of section number twenty-eight, on the north and south quarter line of said section; thence east parallel with the south line of section number twenty-eight, sixty-five rods; thence north parallel to the quarter line ten rods; thence west parallel to the south line of said section to the north and south quarter line ten rods to the place of beginning, excepting a right of way twelve feet wide along the north side of said land to the land adjoining on the east, situate on the southwest quarter line of the northeast quarter of section number twenty-eight, town two south, range six east, City of Ann Arbor, Washtenaw county, Michigan, have platted the same, and

Whereas, the plat of said above described land was presented to the Board of Public Works of said City of Ann Arbor for acceptance, and Whereas, said Board of Public Works authorized the City Clerk of said City



to sign their approved when the owners had signed an agreement approved by the City Attorney, that the cost of an outlet sewer for said property would be assessed against said property,

Now, therefore, we, the undersigned owners, in consideration of the acceptance of the Washington Heights Addition to the City of Ann Arbor, hereby agree, that the cost of an outlet sewer for said district shall be assessed against said property, and paid by the owners of said property, without any cost to the city of Ann Arbor.
