The Honorable, Common Council, Ann Arbor, Mich.: Gentlemen—I beg to submit the following report on the location of the sidewalk on North Main

st. from Chubb rd. to Hamlin st.

I recommend that the sidewalk be built on the west side of the street from Chubb rd to a point seventy-five feet north of the Ann Arbor Railroad transfer track. Then to cross to the east side of the street at this point and continue on the east side to Hamlin st., as shown on the blue print attached.

The Ann Arbor Railroad officials have agreed to move the track leading to the Michigan Milling company, one and one-half feet to the east, also to raise the transfer track so that there will be only one foot difference in elevation between the east and west curbs of thirty feet roadway, and they have further agreed to start work this week.
