From the Mayor—

Sept. 1, 1919.

To the Honorable, the Common
Council, Gentlemen: The local rep-
resentatives of the Detroit, Jackson
& Chicago Railway requested that in
rebuilding their Catherine street
switch or turnout that they be per-
mitted to continue the double track
of this turnout around the corner on-
to Main street.

While this will greatly facilitate the
movement of local cars and be a great
improvement over former conditions,
still I feel it would be far more
practical to double track the then
one remaining block on Main street
and thereby have double tracks
throughout Main street.

I trust that this may receive your
most careful consideration and ac-
tion.
