#### Sidewalk Committee Report

To the Honorable, the Common Council.  
Gentlemen:

Your sidewalk committee respectfully recommends that the following sidewalks be ordered built and the following resolution adopted:

Resolved, That the grading and construction of the sidewalks hereinafter mentioned is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that stone or cement sidewalks be graded, built and constructed in the

City of Ann Arbor on and along the following property:

South side of Geddes ave. east of Oswego; A. J. Decker, lots 4 and 5 Block 2, J. D. Baldwin's eastern addition.

North side Miller avenue from new walk at culvert east to 1st street; Ann Arbor R.
