on the following day when the first or sixteenth falls on Sunday or a legal holiday; and provided, further, that the Mayor and City Clerk are authorized on approval of the Finance Committee, to draw warrants in payment of bills to save discount and include same in next finance report to Council; and provided further, that the Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to draw warrants in payment of city bonds and coupons when presented on or after the dates said bonds and coupons are due.

City Attorney Bonsteel explained that the amendment to Section 88 of the charter was intended to require proper materials and equipment in construction of buildings, that the State Housing Code has to

deal more particularly with ground area and light, and that zoning ordinances can be passed under authority of Act of Legislature and such ordinances may designate certain sections or districts for business residences, detached houses multiple dwellings and factory and industrial purposes. Expert survey may be necessary in order to select proper zoning districts for various purposes named.

Several citizens addressed Council relative to flooded condition near the corner of Division and Hill sts. and matter was referred to Sewer Committee.
