 City Engineer, be referred to the
 sewer committee and said commit-
 tee meet in the room of the Board
 of Public Works at a time to be
 fixed by the chairman of said com-
 mittee for the purpose of making
 due inquiry relative to said sewer
 districts, and after hearing all per-
 sons interested therein and desir-
 ing to be heard said committee re-
 port to council at next regular
 meeting.

Railway Committee Report

The Honorable Common Council,

Gentlemen:

Your Railway committee presents the following report with regard to the local street car lines. At the last meeting of the Council a verbal report was made as to the progress of negotiations with the Detroit, Jackson & Chicago Railway. It had been hoped that the company might furnish figures which would show clearly the cost of doing business in Ann Arbor, and allow the council to judge to what extent the company might properly be asked to make further expenditures for the paving and maintenance of its tracks. The company has submitted an analysis of cost, but its methods of accounting are such that the costs given are for many items "allocated" instead of actual cost. These allocated costs are, as we understand, practically the average costs of all their city lines, including those in Detroit, Flint, as well as Ann Arbor. It is manifest that such figures can have little value when applied directly to Ann Arbor conditions. The company is also unable to tell us the number of interurban passengers carried through Ann Arbor, so that we can form no estimate of the proportion of operation West Huron lines which should be charged to the Interurban traffic and to the local traffic. The situation is, therefore, not all that could be desired.

Mr. E. J. Burdick, General Man-

ager of the Detroit, Jackson and Chicago Railway Co., has today submitted the following proposition.

Dear Sir:

Understanding that your committee has before it at the present time for consideration and action the matter of the street railway conditions and service in the City of Ann Arbor. Further understanding that it is the desire of the City of Ann Arbor that the street railway trackage and equipment be maintained and the furnishing of service thereby be continued, this is intended to state in brief and general outline the terms and conditions upon which the present owners of the street railway trackage and equipment are willing to maintain the same and continue the furnishing of service thereby, viz.:

1. The company to reconstruct the tracks on Packard-av. at or near Granger-st. to the new City Limits to be reconstructed and be paved between the tracks.

2. The company to pave between both tracks of the switch on Hill-st., between Forest-av. and Church-st., and also between the tracks at the intersection of Hill-st. and Lincoln-av. and at the intersection of Hill-st. and Washtenaw-av.

3. The company to pave on Detroit-st. between the tracks for the distance between the lot lines of Division-st. extended and the distance between the lot lines of Kingsley-st. extended.

4. The tracks not now paved or not to be paved as above outlined to be maintained in a similar manner to the tracks on Woodward-av. in the City of Highland Park and on Grand River-av. beyond the old City Limits in the City of Detroit as the same are at present.

5. The Company to operate busses from the new hospital, when put in operation, to the nearest convenient point for making connection with street cars or such other routes as may be hereafter arranged by mutual agreement.

6. The city to grant to the company a day-to-day right to maintain the trackage on the streets where the same now exists. Such

day-to-day right to be terminable by the city upon sixty days' notice to the company.

7. The rate of fare under such day-to-day right shall be determined on the basis provided in the Glaspie Act enacted by the last legislature. If the city and the company cannot agree on the rate of fare the same to be referred to the Michigan Public Utilities Commission for determination. In determining the rate of fare the n-terurban cars to pay a proper charge for the use of the tracks and for any power used from any power station which may be a part of the city system.

8. If the city shall at any time determine to engage in the ownership and operation of street rail-ways, the track and equipment then in the streets shall be purchased by the City at the then fair value of the physical prop-erty thereof to be agreed upon between the City and the Company or failing such agreement to be determined by the Michigan Pub-lic Utilities Commission.

While the foremost outline is very brief and general and would require the working out of many details, it is believed to fairly cover the situation and offer the prop-er basis from which to draft an ordinance defining the rights and obligations of the parties and the terms and conditions upon which service shall be continued to be rendered to the public in the City of Ann Arbor.
