**Communications**  
**Mayor's Veto**

July 3, 1923.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

After deliberation, I veto that part or portion of the proceedings of the Common Council of the city of Ann Arbor at its session held July 2, 1923, relating to the matter of letting the contract for the printing of the proceedings and publications for the city of Ann Arbor for the following reasons:

1. Each bidder was asked to submit with his bid and to be made a part of the bid a sworn statement of the paid circulation of his newspaper in the city of Ann Arbor. The Washtenaw Post did not submit any sworn statement of its circulation.

2. I believe the fundamental reason for publication of the council proceedings and proceedings of the Board of Public Works is to keep the public informed as to what the council and board are doing; consequently it is extremely important that this information as to circulation of the newspaper be given in order that if possible, it shall reach the largest number of taxpayers.

3. I do not believe that the difference in submission of price for the work is commensurate with the publicity that would be given to the proceedings in a publication with a larger circulation.

4. I do not see how under the terms of our charter a weekly paper can publish the proceedings of the Board of Public Works and of the Council within the time specified by the charter which is mandatory as to time of publication. The proceedings of the council must be printed within one week from the date of its meeting; the proceedings of the Board

of Public Works must be published within five days from the date of its meeting, which said bodies meet respectively on the first and third Monday's and Wednesday's of each month; also there are many special meetings.

5. Other legal publications must be made from time to time giving notices of hearings of the several bodies of the city and it will be difficult to handle this matter and expedite the business of the city, if published in the weekly paper.

Your committee further recommends that lateral sewers be constructed on Brooks-st. from end of present sewer to pass lots Nos 93, 100 and 101, James B Gott's Second addition; on Pauline-blvd. from end of present sewer to Fifth-st.; and on Pleasant Place from Jackson Place to Charlton-ave; and that the City Engineer be instructed to prepare plans, specifications and estimates of cost for said lateral sewer.

Your committee further recommends that the construction of the above mentioned relief and lateral sewers is hereby deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements

**Pavement Boundaries and Order of Assessment**

Resolved, that the pavement on South Fourth avenue, from Liberty street to Packard street, known as District No 52; that the pavement on Geddes avenue from Wash-

tenaw avenue to Oxford road, known as District No. 53; and the pavement on South State street, from Arch street to Granger avenue, known as District No. 54; within the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, heretofore ordered, in the opinion of the Common Council are and are hereby deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements.

Resolved, further, that all the lands, tenements and premises, hereinafter mentioned in each particular district are deemed and declared to be benefited by the construction and completion of the respective pavement heretofore ordered, and it is hereby ordered and determined that all the costs of the said respective public improvements, street intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of the cost of said public improvements; excepted, shall be and is hereby ordered to be levied on and assessed against the lands, tenements and premises situated in the respective special assessment district hereinafter designated, and the said special assessment districts are hereby fixed as follows. to-wit: All those certain pieces and parcels of land situated in the city of Ann Arbor, county of Washtenaw, state of Michigan, as follows:

**Pavement Assessment District No 52**

Lots 9 to 15 inclusive and the east 58 feet of lot 16, B. 3 S., R. 4 E.

Lots 9 to 16 inclusive, B. 4 S., R. 4 E.

Lots 1, 2, 3, 4 B. 3 S., R. 5 E., also the following described property: beginning at the southeast corner of E. Liberty-st. and S. Fourth-ave. thence easterly along the south line of Liberty-st. 93 feet; thence south parallel to the east line of S. A strip of land 200 feet deep abutting on the west side of S. State-st and extending from the south line of Arch-st. extended to the south line of Granger-ave. extended.

Resolved, further, that this Common Council requires and orders the sum of Ten thousand six hundred and sixty-seven dollars for District No. 52; the sum of twenty-six thousand six hundred and sixty-seven dollars for District No. 53; the sum of nineteen thousand three hundred and thirty-four dollars for district No. 54; all payable in ten equal annual installments with five per cent interest, or at the option of the taxpayers, in one payment, to be raised by tax and a special assessment on and against the lots, parts of lots, lands, tenements and premises in each district aforesaid and situated in the said respective special assessment district, as a tax against the owners thereof; all to be assessed on and against said lands, tenements and premises according to the benefits coming to each parcel thereof from such local public improvements, and the city assessor is hereby required to levy and assess the said sums of money as aforesaid on and against the lands, tenements and premises aforesaid, and on and upon the special assessment rolls for the respective pavement district aforesaid and on and upon each and every of the regular assessment rolls of the city of Ann Arbor for the year and during which any such special assessment may be payable until the whole of such special assessment shall be paid in full, all to be assessed in the manner and for the purpose aforesaid pursuant to law.

Resolved, further, that the sum of five thousand three hundred and thirty-three dollars for District No. 52; the sum of thirteen thousand three hundred and thirty-three dollars for district No. 53; and the

sum of nine thousand six hundred and sixty-six dollars for district No. 54; is hereby appropriated for the purpose of defraying the cost of such respective public improvements at street and alley intersections and twenty per cent of the balance of cost of said public improvements; all of which sums of money in ten equal annual installments with interest be and the same are hereby ordered and required to be levied, spread and assessed on and upon each and every of the regular annual assessment rolls of the city of Ann Arbor, and on and against all the taxable property within the said city, in and during the period in which any part of this appropriation and assessment is or shall be payable.

Resolved further, that the city clerk do certify this determination and order of assessments to the city assessor, pursuant to law.

Adopted by following vote: Yeas, Ald. Johnson, Slauson, Graf Lucas, Henderson Donnelly, Spathelf, Moore, Freeman, Norris, Gram Pres. Sugden, 12. Nays, none.

#### **Resolution Ordering Pavement Bonds**

Whereas, the Common Council has authorized the construction by the Board of Public Works of pavements known as Fourth Avenue pavement, district No. 52; Geddes Avenue Pavement district No. 53; and S. State Street pavement, district No. 54; and the Common Council having caused to be certified to the city assessor the lands tenements and premises to be assessed for cost of said public improvements, street intersections and twenty per cent of the balance excepted, therefore be it

that being the estimated cost of said improvements, payable to bearer in ten equal annual installments from and after the first day of August, 1923, with interest at five per cent per annum, payable annually on the first day of August in each and every year, as evidenced by interest coupons to be thereto attached, bearing the signatures of the Mayor and city clerk of the city of Ann Arbor, principal and interest to be payable at the office of the city treasurer, city Hall, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Resolved, further, that said mayor and city clerk be and they are hereby authorized and directed to deliver said bonds, when executed, to the city treasurer, and that said bonds and coupons be in substantially the form for pavement bonds and coupons adopted by the Common Council August 4th, 1919.
