Petition to Vacate Land

To the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor:

We, ten freeholders of the city of Ann Arbor Washtenaw county and State of Michigan, respectfully petition your honorable body to vacate a certain strip of land in the city of Ann Arbor, described as follows, to-wit:

"Commencing at an iron pipe marking the northeast corner of block four of R. S. Smith's Third Addition to the city of Ann Arbor, Washtenaw county, Michigan, said iron is 41.67 feet south of the center line of Huron-st. as monumented; thence north along the prolongation of the east line of block four of R. S. Smith's Third Addition 8.67 feet to a point 33 feet south of the center line of Huron-st.; thence west parallel to center line of Huron-st.; and 33 feet south of said center line 441 feet; thence easterly 441 feet to the place of beginning being a triangular piece of land 441 feet long and eight and

sixty-seven hundredths feet at the east and lying south of a line parallel to and 33 feet south of the center line of Huron-st."

Your petitioners further aver that they consider the vacation of the above triangular strip of land a necessity and that the improvement is advisable, therefore, ask your honorable body to fix a time and place when and where the Common Council will meet to consider the same, and that such notice as is necessary be given to any and all persons interested according to the provisions of the Charter.

Resolution

Whereas, There has been presented to the common council of the City of Ann Arbor an application in writing, signed by ten or more free holders of said city, to discontinue and vacate that certain portion or part of East Huron-st. in said city described as follows, to-wit:

"Commencing at an iron pipe marking the northeast corner of block four of R. S. Smith's Third Addition to the City of Ann Arbor, Washtenaw county, Michigan said iron pipe is 41.67 feet south of the center line of Huron-st. as monumented; thence north along the prolongation of the east line of block four of R. S. Smith's Third Addition 8.67 feet to a point 33 feet south of the center line of Huron-st.; thence west parallel to center line of Huron-st. and 33 feet south of said center line 441 feet; thence easterly 441 feet to the place of beginning, being a triangular piece of land 441 feet long and eight and sixty-seven hundredths feet at the east end lying south of a line parallel to and 33 feet south of the center line of Huron-st."

And, Whereas, the Council does hereby determine the proposed improvement advisable, therefore,

Be it Resolved That the Common Council shall give notice of the pendency of the question of

ordering such proposed improvement to the owners, occupants, or persons interested, or his, her or their agent, or representative, by personal service if they reside within the said city; if they shall reside without the said city then said service shall be made by posting up notices in five or more public places in the said city, which notice shall state the time and place, when and where the Common Council will meet to consider the same and shall designate to a common certainty the avenues and streets to be discontinued and vacated, and which notice shall be posted at least ten days before the time of the hearing and at which said meeting the Council shall hear the persons interested therein. And the Council does hereby designate the time and place of said meeting as the 15th day of October, 1923, at 7 o'clock p. m., Eastern Standard time in the Council Chamber City Hall, Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Wm. H. Schaffer—812 E. Washington-st. The W 44 ft. of lots 15 and 16 B 2 S, R 11 E. Eastern Add., one-half to be paid by city.
