#### Ordinance Committee

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE USE OF LANDS FOR PURPOSES OF DUMPING AND PLACING RUBBISH, ASHES AND DEBRIS THEREON AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS THEREOF.

The Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor Ordain:

Section 1. Any lands now used, or hereafter used, or designated for use for the purpose of dumping and placing of rubbish, ashes and debris shall be subject to the supervision and regulation of the Board of Health of the City of Ann Arbor.

Section 2. All rubbish, ashes and debris dumped on said land shall be subject to regulations of the said Board of Health, which Board shall designate the kinds of rubbish and debris that may be dumped and placed upon said land, the disposition thereof, and to see that the regulations therefor are enforced and prevent the uses of said land in such a manner as to be deleterious to the health of the community and prevent the use of same in such manner as shall create a nuisance in the community.

Section 3. Any persons making use of said lands for the purposes herein provided shall do so subject to the rules and regulations as established by the Board of Health.

Section 4. Any person who shall be found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, or of failing to obey any reasonable direction or instruction of the Board of Health given under the authority herein granted, shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the city lock-up or the Washtenaw County jail for a period of time not to exceed ninety days; or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.
