Maynard-st Pavement Resolution

By Ald. Moore,
Whereas, this Common Council has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same, praying for grading and paving of Maynard-sts. between William-st. and Jefferson-st. within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and

Whereas, the grading and paving of that part of Maynard-st. within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore, be it

Resolved, that it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Common Council to cause said

Maynard-st. within the limits aforesaid, to be graded and paved under the Charter and Ordinance of the City of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners

Resolved, further, that the cost and expense of the construction of such public improvement shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows:

All street and public alley intersections, and 20 per cent of the remaining shall be paid by the city, and the remainder shall be assessed and paid by special assessment levied and assessed, according to benefits on and against all the lands, tenements and premises lying on or fronting said Maynard-st. within the limits aforesaid

Resolved, further, that the said petition, along with this determination, be and the same is hereby referred to the Board of Public Works, to report to the council with all convenient dispatch suitable plans with specification for the said improvement, the kind and quality to be used therefor, together with an estimate of the probable cost and expense of such public improvement.

Sidewalk Committee Report

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your Sidewalk Committee respectfully recommends that the following sidewalks be ordered built and the following resolution adopted:

Resolved, That the grading and construction of the sidewalks hereinafter mentioned be deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that Portland cement concrete sidewalks be graded, built and constructed in the City of Ann Arbor on and along the following property; width of walk to be five feet unless otherwise stated:

On Northeast side of Swift-st. from Broadway to Wright st. and on east side of Wright st., from Swift st. to Cedar st. along Spat-helf, Ann Arbor Fluff Rug, Gross, Moore and Ann Arbor Railroad properties:

Lot 1, B 7, Brown and Fuller's add. except a parcel taken from

Sely side. said exception described as follows: Beginning at the SE corner of said lot 1, thence SW on Nly line of Broadway to a point 28 feet, 5 inches NEly of Swift st., thence NWly at right angles to Broadway 40 ft. NEly parallel to Broadway 46 ft. NWly at right angles to Broadway 20 ft. NEly parallel to Broadway 66 ft thence SEly to beginning.
