I desire to call your attention to certain conditions existing on Ridgeway Road. This section is being rapidly built up, but is without a proper sewerage system. The residents having put in septic tanks, it is only a question of time when these tanks, under constant use will become filled, and thus create an immediate and serious menace as well as nuisance. The problem then will be to empty such tanks.

I respectfully ask therefore, that this whole matter be referred to the proper committee of council, and perhaps also to the Engineering Department, with the request that a careful survey of this situation be made, hoping that a remedy be found before serious trouble develops in the locality in question.

To the Honorable, the Mayor and the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor,  
Gentlemen:

At the suggestion of his honor, the Mayor, and some of the Councilmen, the Peoples Motor Coach Company submits the following tentative proposition for the furnishing by means of motor buses of all of the local transportation needs of the city of Ann Arbor:

The Company will equip and put in operation on such streets and avenues as may be designated by the Common Council a line of motor buses of modern make and sufficient capacity to handle all of the people to a number of not less than twelve and will operate the same for a trial period of one year from and after this date at the following rate of fare:

Single fares are ten cents

Three tickets or tokens for twenty five cents

Universal free transfers on all lines

Children under five years of age accompanied by person paying full fare to be carried free.

After the expiration of the one year trial period if the service is satisfactory, the company will ask the council to submit to the people for ratification a proposition for a continuance of the service for a period of ten years on the basis substantially as mentioned in the attached memorandum.

The company will be glad to discuss with the council the question of providing necessary transportation for school children at a reasonable and proper special rate of fare.
