**Ordinance Committee. ....**

Ald. Freeman presented an ordinance entitled:

An Ordinance Relative to Liberty Street, Washington street sub-main and Buena Vista sanitary sewer, known as District number 144, and Westwood Hills and Huron street, West Park sub-main sanitary sewer, known as District number 147, all in the City of Ann Arbor, County of Washtenaw, State of Michigan.

Whereas, the foregoing described sewers have been constructed in the sewer districts numbers 144 and 147 as shown by the districts in the engineering office for the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and,

Whereas, the said sewers are of greater benefit to other portions of said city than that immediately adjacent and contiguous to said sewers as herein described, and,

Whereas, the entire cost of said sewers should not be spread upon the territory immediately contiguous and adjacent thereto because of the fact that the benefits are accessible to other portions of said city and it would be unfair to the property owners in said sewer dis-

tricts to assess the entire cost of said sewers against their property.

Now, therefore, the common council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1. That section two of an ordinance entitled, "An ordinance regulating, restricting and districting the location of residences, trades, industries, businesses and the location of buildings designed for specified uses, and establishing the boundaries of districts for the said purposes, providing for and establishing set back line and providing for the violation of said ordinances," passed September 4, 1923, approved September 6, 1923, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2. Use District Regulations.

In order to regulate and restrict the location of residences, trades, industries, businesses and the location of buildings designed for specified uses, the city of Ann Arbor is hereby divided into "Use Districts" of which there shall be four known as

"A"—Residence District.

"B"—Residence District.

"C"—Local Business District.

"D"—Commercial and Industrial District.

The city of Ann Arbor is hereby divided into four (4) districts and the boundaries of such districts are shown upon the map attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance being designated as the "Map of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, 1923-1925, showing Districts for Use Regulations," and said map and all notations, references and other things shown thereon shall be as much a part of this ordinance as if the matters and things set forth by said map were all fully described herein.

Except as hereinafter provided no buildings shall be erected or altered, nor shall any building or premises be used for any purpose other than is permitted in the Use District in which such building or premises is located.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force on and after ten days from legal publication.

#### **Railway Committee Report.**

Your Railway Committee reports the receipt of documents signed by the officials of the Peoples Motor Coach Co and the Detroit, Jackson and Chicago Railway Co., execut-

ing the agreement previously approved by the council with regard to bus operation. These documents have been received so recently that the city attorney has not had time to check them. We recommend, upon approval of said agreement by the City Attorney, the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to execute said agreements for and on behalf of the City of Ann Arbor.

Your Railway Committee has also agreed with the People's Motor Coach Co with regard to routes of bus operation and presents herewith copy of the proposed schedule and recommends its approval, subject to future change by the council in said routes or additions thereto.
