Ordinance Committee

Ald. Haarer presented the following:

An ordinance relative to Liberty street, Washington street, sub-Main and Buena Vista sanitary sewer, known as district number 144 and Westwood Hills and Huron street, West Park sub-main sanitary sewer, known as district number 147 all in the city of Ann Arbor, county of Washtenaw, state of Michigan.

Whereas, the foregoing described sewers have been constructed in the sewer districts numbers 144 and 147 as shown by the districts

in the engineering office for the city of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and

Whereas, the said sewers are of greater benefit to other portions of said city than that immediately adjacent and contiguous to said sewers as herein described, and

Whereas, the entire cost of said sewers should not be spread upon the territory immediately contiguous and adjacent thereto because of the fact that the benefits are accessible to other portions of said city and it would be unfair to the property owners in said sewer districts to assess the entire cost of said sewers against their property,

Now, therefore, the common council of the City of Ann Arbor ordain:

Section 1. The Common Council, having deemed it expedient to construct said sewers as herein described in sewer districts numbers 144 and 147, reference being hereby made to the said districts as outlined in the map in the City Engineer's office of the city of Ann Arbor, and proceedings having been had as provided in an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance Relative to Sewers, Providing for a system of Lateral and Connecting Sewers in the City of Ann Arbor" the Common Council may appropriate for the costs of construction of said sanitary sewer work such an amount of the costs thereof as the Common Council shall deem just for the city to pay in addition to the cost of street crossings and may make such appropriations by suitable resolutions.

Section 2. The proceedings relative to the construction of said sanitary sewers has been in accordance with an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Relative to Sewers Providing for a System of Lateral and Connecting sewers in the City of Ann Arbor," passed May 21, 1894; approved May 23, 1894; amended Jan. 3 1899; amended Aug. 17, 1903; amended March 12, 1906; amended March 18, 1907; in all respects except as herein otherwise provided and expressed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force ten days after legal publication thereof

which was given its third reading.

The Chair put the question, "Shall this ordinance pass?"
