Special Committee on Salaries

Ald. Gram, Chairman of Special Committee on salaries, presented "Memorandum on proposed plan for compensating municipal employes" from Griffenhagen & Associates, Ltd., and made oral report that gross increases in proposed salaries would be approximately \$5,000 and that he was authorized by the Special Committee to present following resolution at this time:

By Ald. Gram:

Resolved, that beginning April 13th, 1925, the salaries of the City Clerk and City Assessor be and are hereby fixed for the next ensuing term of office for two years as follows: City Clerk \$3,300 per year and City Assessor \$3,000 per year, said salaries to be paid in equal installments on the first day of each month.

Resolved, further, that beginning April 13th, 1925, all fees and moneys received for services other than compensation allowed by council rendered by city officials as prescribed by the charter and ordinances of said city or statutes of the State of Michigan, and acting in their official capacities, shall be paid into the City Treasury

in the month in which said fees or moneys are received.

Street Committee**Pavement Resolution**

Whereas, this Common Council has been applied to in writing by a majority of the owners of the lands, which are liable to be assessed for the payment of the construction of the same praying for the grading and paving of E. Ann st. between Glen ave. and Fourteenth st. within the corporate limits of the City of Ann Arbor, Michigan, and

Whereas, the grading and paving of that part of E. Ann st. within the limits aforesaid, is deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement; therefore, be it

Resolved, that it is hereby declared to be the purpose of the Common Council to cause said E. Ann st., within the limits aforesaid to be graded and paved under the Charter and Ordinance of the City of Ann Arbor, and in pursuance of the prayer of said petitioners.

Resolved, further, that the cost and expense of the construction of such public improvement shall be charged, assessed and paid as follows:

All street and public alley intersections, and 20 per cent of the re-

maining shall be paid by the city, and the remainder shall be assessed and paid by special assessment levied and assessed, according to benefits on and against all the lands, tenements and premises lying on or fronting said E. Ann st., within the limits a or said.

Resolved, further, that the said petition, along with this determination, be and the same is hereby referred to the Board of Public Works to report to the council with all convenient dispatch, suitable plans, with specifications for the said proposed improvement, the kind and quality of material to be used therefor, together with an estimate of the probable cost and expense of such public improvement.
