Sewer Committee Report.

To the Honorable, the Common Council:

Gentlemen: Your Sewer Committee has had the following matters under consideration and respectfully recommend that the lateral sewers in lateral sewer districts No. 155, on Pauline-blvd., from Fifth-st. to the city limits, and on Hutchins-ave. from Pauline-blvd. south to the middle of the block; No. 156, on Maiden Lane from Broadway easterly to public alley and thence to Wall-st.; No. 157, on Madison-s., from Ober White Blvd to Soule blvd., on Soule blvd. from Elder blvd. south to end of said blvd., and on Elder blvd. from Soule blvd. to west end of said blvd.; No. 158, on Daniel-st. from Summit-st. north 200 ft.; No. 159, on all streets in Oak Crest sub-div.; No. 160, on Traver-st. from Moore-st. to Plum-st.; No. 161, on Ferdon-rd. from Morton-ave. to Granger-ave * and on Brooklyn-ave. from Ferdon-rd. to Wallingford-rd.; No. 162, on Ridgeway-Harvard-Highland Rd. & Boulevard Sub-main; No. 163, on Brockman blvd. from Copley-ave. to Washtenaw-ave.; No. 164, on Brooklyn-ave. from Golden-ave. to Packard-st.; No. 165, on Keech-ave. and on Fisher-ave. from Greene-st. to Main-st.; No. 166, on Mount Pleasant-ave. from Madison-st. to Manhattan Drive; No. 167, on Pine Ridge from Huron-st.-West Park sub-main to Maryfield Drive, including the reports thereon by the City Engineer, be referred to the Sewer Committee and said committee meet in the room of the Board of Public Works at a time to be fixed by the chairman of said committee for the purpose of making due inquiry relative to said sewer districts and, after hearing all persons interested

therein and desiring to be heard, said committee report to council at next regular meeting thereafter.

That a lateral sewer be constructed on Chubb Road from Spring-st. to Miner-st. and that the Board of Public Works cause to be prepared plans, specifications and estimate of cost for said lateral sewer and that the construction of the same is hereby deemed and declared to be a necessary public improvement.

Street Committee Report

To the Honorable, the Common Council,
Gentlemen:

Your Street Committee has had the following matters under consideration and respectfully recommends:

1. That Brooklyn ave be opened, graded and gravelled from east line of Fenwood addition to Wallingford road across City property

2 That the Board of Public Works be instructed to increase the radius of curb return to 25 feet at the southeast corner of Cambridge road and Hill st.

3. That the Board of Public Works be instructed to round off as much as possible the northeast and southwest corners of Hill st. and Oxford road.

Report of Water Committee.

The Water Committee of the Common Council, at the call of the Mayor of the City, met with the Board of Water Commissioners and other city officials at the Mayor's office Tuesday, July 14th, for the purpose of considering the matter of an adequate water supply for the City and after a very full and frank discussion of the situation it was unanimously decided:

1. To take such steps as shall be deemed necessary to ascertain whether or not there is sufficient water in the Steere farm area to supply the City of Ann Arbor without going to the Huron River.

2. To make a full and complete investigation of the question of a filtration plant, cost of installation and operation and to determine whether or not the Huron River is a proper source of supply and to gather together all the facts relating to the filtration plant idea so that the Council can have a complete report of what is necessary should it be determined advisable to go to the Huron River for the future supply of water for the City of Ann Arbor.

3. That the Board of Water Commissioners immediately get re-

ports on both the Steere farm and filtration plant so that the Common Council of the City and the citizens of the City can be advised as quickly as possible as to the proper solution of the water question.

We respectfully ask the Common Council to authorize the Board of Water Commissioners to proceed with the investigation at once and report back to the Common Council as quickly as possible consistent with a complete investigation of both the source of supply at the Steere farm and the filtration plant idea proposal.
