Ann Arbor, Mich., Oct. 16, 1925.
To the Honorable, the Common Council

Gentlemen:

I submit the following report of sidewalks built by the Board of Public Works and charged to the property owners, as per your order. The amount placed after each description being the actual cost of the walk with ten per cent added, this being the amount which is a lien upon the property, in accordance with an ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance to regulate and provide for the grading, constructing, building, repairing, renewing and rebuilding of sidewalks and providing for the cost, collection and assessment thereof when built, repaired or rebuilt by the city and to repeal any and all ordinances conflicting therewith."
