Resolution for Public Hearing on Closing Alley.

By Ald. Sweet,

Whereas, there has been presented to the Common Council of the City of Ann Arbor an application in writing, signed by ten freeholders of the city, to discontinue and vacate a certain alley in said city as follows, to-wit:

An alley in block number one north, range two east as shown on the Original Plat of the village of Ann Arbor, said alley being 16 feet in width east and west and extending south about 132 feet from the south line of Ann Street to the middle line, running east and west, through said Block bounded on the east side by the west line of Lot number 7 and lot number 8, on the west side by the east line of lots number five and six, all of said alley being in the city of Ann Arbor, Washtenaw County, Michigan; and

Whereas, the Common Council has hereby determined the proposed improvement advisable, therefore be it

Resolved, that the Common Council shall give notice of the pendency of the question of ordering such proposed improvement to the owners, occupants or persons interested, or his, her or their agents or representatives, by personal service, if they reside within the said city. If they shall reside without the said city, then said notice shall be made by posting up notices in five or more public places in said city, which notices shall state the time and place when and where the common council will meet to consider the same and shall designate to a common certainty the alley to be discontinued and vacated, which said notice shall be posted at least ten days before the time of the hearing at which said meeting the Common Council shall hear the persons interested therein. And the Common Council does hereby designate the time and place of said meeting at the 15th day of February, A. D. 1926, at 7:00 o'clock p. m. Eastern Standard time, in the Council Chamber of the City Hall in said city of Ann Arbor, Michigan.

Sec. 83. Any officer appointed by the Mayor may be suspended or removed by him, by and with the consent of the majority of the members elect of the council and the council may expel any alderman or remove from office any

person elected thereto, except justices of the peace, by a concurring vote of two-thirds of all the aldermen elect. In case of elective officers, provision shall be made by ordinance for preferring charges and trying the same, and no removal of any elective officer shall be made unless a charge in writing is preferred and opportunity given him to make defense thereto."

"Sec. 83. Burton on Seneca st., that the Christman Co., had agreed to build this sidewalk for Mrs. Burton and requested city contractor to delay construction, that walk had been constructed by city contractor and cost is now assessed against Mrs. Burton's property, and requested that matter be referred to Sidewalk committee.

On motion of Ald. Jocelyn, matter was referred to Sidewalk committee.

Ald. Graf called attention that sufficient lanterns were not placed at the Fuller st. Bridge and matter was referred to City Engineer.

On motion of Ald. Jocelyn, Council adjourned.
