Your Sidewalk Committee respectfully recommends that the following sidewalks be ordered built and the following resolution adopted:

Resolved, That the grading and construction of sidewalks hereinafter mentioned is deemed and declared to be necessary public improvements.

Therefore, It is hereby ordered that Portland Cement concrete sidewalks be graded, built and constructed in the City of Ann Arbor on and along the following property; width of walk to be five feet unless otherwise stated:

North State Street—

East side, new walks at Nos. 204 and 406:

Repairs, No. 200, 4 or more blocks; at property line between Nos. 210 and 216, level up or down;

at No. 418 new driveway and four new blocks.

Lots 1 and 8, B 2 N, R 10 E, Eastern Add.

Lot 3 and the W 5 rods of lot 1, B 4 N, R 10 E, Eastern Add.

South State Street-

West side, at Groves block. Repair four to eight blocks.

Lot 13. Assessor's Plat No. 10, part of the NE 1-4, Sec. 29, Ann Arbor, being lot 5, B 2 S, R 9 E.

Twelfth Street— West side, No. 220.

Walk is low and water stands on it, either a new walk or lawn extension to be lowered. If a new walk, city should bear the expense. No. 226, repair 2 or 3 blocks.

Lots 12 and 13, B 2 S, R 12 E, Eastern Add.

North Fourth Avenue-

Nos. 207, 209, 211, on West side and

Nos. 208, 212, inc. on East side. All extended to curb.
