Gentlemen:

Commencing July 1st, 1927, your Board of Police Commissioners propose to operate the Police Department under a system of three, eight hour shifts. This will necessitate the addition of eight men to the present personnel of the police force. Of this number seven will be needed as patrolmen and one additional desk sergeant.

The Board of Police Commissioners therefore respectfully recommend that they be authorized to employ seven additional first year men at a salary of \$144.00 per month each and additional desk sergeant at a salary of \$166.00 per month. Said employment to commence July 1, 1927 and that the men so appointed be paid at the same time that other employees of the Police Department receive their pay.

The Commission desires to have your Honorable Body understand however, that even after the creation of three, eight hour shifts in the Police Department, that all of the men in the Department will be subject to call at all times.
