We have examined transcript of proceedings for the issue by Arbor, Washtenaw City of Ann County, Michigan, of bonds in the aggregate principal sum of \$175,-000 in anticipation of the collection of taxes and assessments for paving streets, as follows:

District No. 72, Ingalls and Kingsley Streets, \$35,000, being 30 bonds of \$1,000 each and 10 bonds of \$500 each, numbered 1 to 40, inclusive.

District No. 74, North Main . Street, \$20,000, being 20 bonds of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 20, inclusive.

District No. 76, Dexter Avenue, \$40,000, being 40 bonds of \$1,000 each, numbered 1 to 40, inclusive.

District No. 79, South Street, \$15,000, being 10 bonds of \$1,000 each, and 10 bonds of \$500 each, numbered 1 to 20, inclusive.

District No. 80, North Seventh Street, \$15,000, being 10 bonds of \$1,000 each and 10 bonds of \$500 each, numbered 1 to 20, inclusive.
